**George Green, Leyland Line
Wharfinger Placed Under
Arrest**

Says The Gleaner of Dec. 29: In connection with the strike of the dockmen, an incident took place outside the Leyland Line wharf gate yesterday morning in which a revolver was used, with the result that a man named David Brown, said to be a labourer, received a flesh wound in the left leg, just above the ankle from a bullet, while the wharfinger at the Leyland Line wharf, Mr. George Green, was taken in custody on a charge of having fired the shot.

Mr. Green was roughly handled and received a flesh wound on his back before he succeeded in getting away from the men who had assembled in front of his gate. After he got clear of the hostile crowd, he had to take refuge on board the wharfship New Zealand, for a short time, in which he was taken up to the general Penitentiary, where he saw the Inspector General, Mr. Clark, and Mr. Bernard O'Toole, the Deputy Inspector General, and pointed the matter to them.

The strikers and their sympathizers heard of Green's fate gone up to the Penitentiary and soon they wended their way to this institution in thousands, some carrying sticks, bricks, bottles, stones, knives and machettes. The news reached Sutton Street Station of the attitude of the crowd and a squad of armed policemen, under Sub-Inspector Magee, went to the Penitentiary and the Inspector, with his usual tact, got the crowd to disperse from in front of the prison gate. The crowd then started back to the waterfront, walking along Tower Street. In Gold Street, a gentleman was roughly handled by a number of the men said to be strikers, while a house in Lower Gold Street was stoned, and several pieces of glass broken. At May Lane and Tower Street, a celestial was assaulted in the crowd, and then the strikers went back to Orange Street, where they remained until the police came and dispersed. After everything was quiet in Tower Street, Mr. Green was taken from the Penitentiary in the Inspector General's motor car to Sutton Street, where he was charged with shooting with intent on David Brown, and he will be tried before the court today. The police were willing to grant bail, but Mr. Green did not accept the offer.

Mr. Stoute charged me with intentionally withholding part of the sum I mean as regards the Presidential Department, etc. He seems to forget that one fight is not to mention when life is extinct but rather to keep the fires of life burning for a reasonable length of time. If there is a time for everything it is the time for active and tangible representation. A local Editor after somewhat laconically sprang his editorial with aspersive words, actually admitted that "the time the members became impatient." If it is time, then why such objection to a public confession of impatience? Are we confessing for a cause known only to the few, or is it a matter of public knowledge that our position is unassailable? Why not increase our capacity for adapting war-time measures? Which course proved more beneficial to the Allied cause? Withholding facts is openly admitting.

THE TRAFFIC PROBLEM**T**HE Rotary Club is showing a proper interest in the welfare of the city by concern itself with the traffic problem and is adopting the right attitude by going into conference with the police authorities about it.

The regulation of traffic in Panama is made difficult by various local conditions. It is not light or fair to place all of the blame and responsibility on the police department as it is complicated by difficulties that in other cities may not take into consideration.

The first difficulty encountered in trying to regulate traffic in Panama is the streets. Most of them are too narrow and there is little chance of making any of them wider. Then there are almost no streets that parallel Central Avenue, indeed practically all of the traffic is crowded. There is little congestion on Central Avenue from Santa Ana Plaza to the seawall for the reason that part of the traffic can be shifted to Avenue A, and there are one-way regulations around Plaza Central. The Avenue is quite narrow between the Cathedral and the International Bank, but that cannot be remedied.

From Santa Ana Plaza to the California Bridge there is no street running parallel to Central Avenue to which traffic could be shifted in order to relieve the congestion. Colon Street might be used if it were possible to reach it from the Plaza, but it is short and its use would probably only make more regulation necessary at another part of the Avenue. Going to the left from Santa Ana in the direction of California is a devious route on streets that are narrow and crooked, some without adequate side walks for the protection of pedestrians and with a population unused to vehicle traffic.

Of course the most congested spot in the city is at Santa Ana Plaza. There it would seem that some relief could be obtained from widening the street in front of the Metropole Hotel. This could be done by reducing the side walk on the Central Avenue side of the Plaza. With a double track for the trams there is little room left on this section of Central Avenue for other traffic when cars are passing.


In considering the traffic problem one must not overlook the variety of traffic which greatly complicates the question. It is hard to make an accurate assessment of an assortment of vehicles that ranges from motor cars trying to do sixty miles an hour to the iron-wheeled push carts that carry produce from the market. Then mixed with these two extremes we have the leisurely moving teamsters, coaches of various rates of speed, lumbering motor-trucks, and dashing motorcycles.

Another thing that adds to the difficulty of solving the problem is the disregard of the attempts that the police authorities are making to regulate traffic. Motor cars trying to dash ahead of each other and ahead of coaches and coachmen getting revenue by driving in a show walk or swinging across the street to block the motors, and the "char" people in high-powered cars who dash along at excessive rates of speed and feel too important to pay any attention to the signals of the traffic officers. The traffic problem cannot be solved without cooperation and if that cannot be secured the only resort is to arrest and fine people who refuse to obey signals regardless of their position.

Some of the people who complain most about traffic regulations and criticize the police most severely probably never pay any attention to the traffic officer's signals.


