BAHIA BLANCA TO SAIL FOR BOSTON DESPITE BRITISH

Former German Ship Purchased by Argentine in Transaction not Recognized by England. Will Fly Argentine Flag.

Officials State There is No Question as to Argentine's Right to Own Ship as British Attitude They Claim is No Factor.

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 10.—The former German steamship Bahia Blanca, purchased by the Argentine government during the war, will leave Buenos Aires shortly for the United States on her first trip of the high seas flying the Argentine flag and notwithstanding the fact that the British government so far as can be learned here has not yet recognized the ships sale to Argentina.

The government has announced that the ship's cargo space has been chartered to a private shipping concern which proves to be the agent for the New York exporters Christensen, Hanater and Whittier.

Will Sail for Boston The agents say that the vessel will sail for Boston early in February with a cargo of linseed oil and butter.

It is learned from government sources that she will return from Boston with a cargo for the government, including coal. The position of the Argentine government as outlined to the Associated Press by high government officials is that the purchase of the ship was made in strict accordance with the provisions of international law and the circumstance whether the sale is recognized or not by some other government cannot be considered.

Attitude No Factor The inquiry as to whether there had been any change in the attitude of the British government, met with the response that inasmuch as there could not be any question as to the right of the Argentine government to possess the ship, the attitude of the British government was no factor.

According to recent dispatches from London, the British government has been willing that the Bahia Blanca fly the Interallied flag pending a decision from the inter-allied reparations commission as to the status of the vessel but in the meantime it would submit the question to the Interallied transport commission.

Meet No Response The opening of the bids for chartering the vessel's cargo space a month ago for a voyage to Europe did not meet with any response. The explanation for this indifference in shipping circles being that the insurance companies refused insurance on the cargo bearing sea by a British cruiser. For the coming voyage, the Argentine agents say that a British company has insured the cargo.

The Bahia Blanca is taking on a twenty seven days supply of coal by which it is pointed out in shipping circles that she will not need to refuel in Barbados or other British coaling stations ordinarily used between North and South America.

CAPTURE BOKHARA

LONDON, Jan. 10.—The War Office reports that the Bolsheviks captured Bokhara near the Afghan-Uzbek frontier. The capture is considered important to the plans of the Bolsheviks to enter India and start an offensive against the British.

FOREIGN BUSINESS PROTESTS

BARCELONA, Jan. 10.—Thursday night the presidents of the British, American, French and Italian chambers of commerce visited the civil governor protesting against the intolerable situation.

The governor asserted that the government was determined to restore order in order to allow the resumption of work particularly as regards shipping and railway transportation.

UNCONFIRMED REPORTS ALLEGED GERMANY IS IN SOCIALISTS' HANDS

By The Associated Press. BRUSSELS, Jan. 10.—Travelers from Germany bring unconfirmed reports that the German government has been overthrown.

It is reported that the socialists are masters of the situation and that a general strike has been declared throughout the unoccupied territories.

LONDON, Jan. 10.—Messengers arriving here from Berlin via Copenhagen, dated this morning, declare that there are no indications of anything extraordinary could be foreseen in Germany up to a late hour last night.

AMERICAN EXPORTS TO ARGENTINE MUST GROW

Secretary of Commerce Alexander Says Increase is Necessary to Maintain Closer Parity Between American and Argentine Exchange

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10.—Secretary of Commerce Alexander issued a statement to the effect that the exports of American merchandise to Argentina must increase in order to keep the Argentine exchange in closer parity with the United States and to draw further on her gold reserves to liquidate the adverse balance.

He said that the exchange had improved during the last seven months due to the shipment of more than \$20,000,000 in gold to Argentina and improvements in the export trade.

The trade balance during the first eleven months of 1919 was approximately \$20,000,000 compared to \$125,000,000 for the same period in 1918.

The secretary further added that Argentina with her present great prosperity can absorb large quantities of all class of commodities.

DANISH COMPANY TO TRANSPORT REDS FROM UNITED STATES

Government Will Aid Dependents of Deported Alien Radicals.

STOCKHOLM, Jan. 10.—A dispatch from Helsingfors says that Estonia has agreed to transfer General Videmich's army to reinforce General Denikin. It is understood that the transfer will be made by water.

FLAMES CONTINUE TO ISSUE FORTH FROM VOLCANO

Country for Miles Around San Miguel is Covered With Lava Contaminated Water. Poisonous Gases Cause Deaths

Old Volcano Cofre de Perote May Become Active Once More as Huge Cracks Have Appeared on Mountain's Side. It is Feared

MEXICO CITY, Jan. 10.—Flames continue to issue forth from the San Miguel volcano and the surrounding country is covered with lava contaminated water for miles around. Refugees arriving here report that many deaths have been caused by the poisonous gases expelled from the volcano.

It is feared that the old volcano Cofre del Perote may become active once more as huge cracks have appeared on the mountain's side.

Relief measures for the earthquake sufferers are progressing. Three hundred thousand pesos have already been subscribed by the employees of the National Railway and 500,000 by the army.

CARNIVAL OPENS LAST NIGHT WITH RAISING OF FLAG

President McGinnis and Commission Assist Flag Hoisting Committee in Inauguration of Carnival

It is carnival time in Panama from now on until Ash Wednesday as the blue and white pennons are floating from their staves in Cathedral Plaza and Santa Ana and De Lesseps parks.

President McGinnis and the carnival commission with a band attended the ceremonies of which chairman De Caceres of the flag hoisting committee was in charge. The commission, headed by the president and first went to the president's palace, then to the alcalde's residence and afterwards to the different parks where the banners were hoisted.

DUTCH LEGISLATORS WANT KAISER TO GO BACK TO GERMANY

First Chamber of Parliament Presents Memorandum to Cabinet Present Dutch Government is Reported Strongly Opposed to Surrendering Without

THE HAGUE, Jan. 10.—The first chamber of the Dutch Parliament has drafted a memorandum which has been presented to the cabinet suggesting that it is now desirable that the ex-German Emperor be requested to return to his own country.

According to the ordinary course of parliamentary procedure, the government must answer.

The present Dutch government is firmly decided not to surrender the ex-Kaiser, as far as the Associated Press is able to learn. Although it recently seemed that there would be a Cabinet Crisis, it now appears probable that the government will fail.

The most opposed measure of the government which has already passed and referred to the forest loan under which every Dutchman owning property valued at more than 25,000 florins or an income of more than 1,000 florins must subscribe.

VATICAN ANXIOUS OVER FATE OF ST. SOFIA

Famous Basilica is Given to Greeks. Vatican Will Yield to Force. Profesting Against Violation of Catholics' Rights

ROME, Jan. 10.—Considerable anxiety is felt in the Vatican over the fate of Constantinople's famous Basilica of St. Sofia, which crosses perhaps as the finest example of the Byzantine style.

Similar anxiety was felt during the war especially in 1915 when the spot concerned that Constantinople had been assigned to Russia. The Vatican saw in this eventuality the installation of the Orthodox religion on the Bosphorus thus causing the revival of the ancient religious rivalry between the Byzantines and Rome.

However, the fall of the Russian Empire allowed the Vatican fears that there soon arose danger from Greece who also is champion of the Greeks who also is champion of the Greeks.

According to the latest Vatican information, Greece's installation in Constantinople seems to be excluded pending instead to the probability of the League of Nations assuming sovereignty over the administration of the city.

The Orthodox Greeks claim St. Sofia, on the grounds that they form the majority of the European population of Constantinople. The Vatican opposes this claim recalling that the allies fought and conquered on the principle that right must not be reckoned merely by force and numbers but by justice which must be the same for the great and the small. If St. Sofia is given to the Greeks the Vatican will yield to force protesting against the violation of the rights of the Catholics.

HIGH COMMODITY PRICES BARRIER IN MARKET NOW

General Industrial and Commercial Conditions are Encouraging but Investment Situation was Disappointing

Contraction of Unnecessary Credits Renews Unsettlement in Foreign Exchange. Moderate Selling Reactionary.

NEW YORK, Jan. 10.—The general industrial and commercial conditions are encouraging but the high commodity prices are the barrier at present. The contraction of unnecessary credits, renewed unsettlement in the foreign exchange and more confusion in the status of railway legislation, provoked a moderate selling in this week's reactionary stock market.

The investment situation was disappointing. Corn is strong and higher with small receipts, while oats showed up firmer due partly to export buying.

Hides showed a firmer tone with reduced stocks in anticipation of the European demand. When the exchange became more normal the manufacturers predict a further advance in shoes.

AMERICA GIVES TREE SEEDS TO EUROPE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10.—Thirty five million tree seeds, making the most unique New Year's gift occasion ever made another, are on the way to Europe. The American Forestry Association announced today they are intended for foresting the battle areas of France and Belgium and the depleted forests and woodlands of Great Britain.

The seeds were prepared by funds raised by members of the association. They include Douglas Fir, Western Larch, White Fir, European Spruce, Red Oak, Sycamore, White Ash and Tule. More seeds are to be sent when funds are available.

NEW WIRELESS STATION

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 10.—The construction work on the Lafayette radio station the largest and most powerful in the world has been finished and the installation of the electrical equipment will be completed in the spring.

The aerials will be attached to eight steel towers 100 feet high. The power of this station will be so great that it is believed that any station in the world, regardless of static conditions, will be able to receive its messages.

ADHERES TO PROPOSAL

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 10.—Daily was adhered to the proposal the Argentine government made last October for the conclusion of international commercial treaties to remove tariffs on articles of first necessity in order to reduce the cost of living.

The Argentinean foreign office has received a notification to this effect from the Italian minister. REACH NEW YORK NEW YORK, Jan. 10.—Pompeo Garza, Minister of Finance, Tomas Salcedo, ex-Minister of Finance and Ernesto Cortez Sot, a prominent Colombian banker, are the Colombian delegates to the Second Pan American Financial Conference to be held during this month in Washington arriving here today from Portobello. They said that they intended seeking financial assistance for dredging the Magdalena river.

SYNDICALIST DIES IN MUTINY STARTED IN ARTILLERY UNIT

SARAGOSSA, Jan. 10.—Mutiny occurred in the Ninth artillery, under the leadership of the Syndicalist Chetia, who murdered the officer and sergeant of the guard.

The mutiny was however successfully quelled and Chetia killed and three soldiers wounded. One of the mutineers were punished and nine others have deserted and are now being actively sought for.

SHRINERS LEAD 66 WHITE GOATS TO SLAUGHTER

SIXTY SIX WERE ACCEPTED INTO VAO N M S AT ANNUAL CEREMONIAL AT PIER 15, BALBOA LAST NIGHT WITH APPROPRIATE CEREMONY

Followed to a wagon of camels driven by Roy Grandell, guided by Marshal L. C. Gallovy, six (6) white goats, headless and closely shorn six feet apart, were led across the hot sands of Bishop's Hollow, over the hills and dunes of Ancon crossing the plans of Balboa to Pier 15 where a general halloo or took place, the principal butchers performing their duties with old pan of the use of anesthesia.

RATIFICATIONS EXCHANGE TOOK SEVEN MINUTES

VON LERSNER SIGNED PROTOCOL AT 4:09 O'CLOCK AND GERMANY WAS COMPLETED AT 4:18 BY EXCHANGE OF RATIFICATIONS

Eight Preliminary Documents Concerning Details of Treaty Enforcements Were Signed in Preparation for Exchange

PARIS, Jan. 10.—Von Lersner, head of the German Peace Delegation signed the protocol this afternoon at 4:09 o'clock and at 4:15 the ratifications were exchanged, the entire ceremony ended at 4:18 o'clock.

Five of these documents are between the allies and the Germans concerning Silesia and other territories affected by the treaty and the other three are between the Poles and the Germans for setting the details of their relations in the treaty enforcement.

In Two Parts The exchange of ratifications ceremony between the allies and Germany this afternoon, restoring the pre-war status of the nations, was divided in two parts.

The first part was carried out in the French Foreign Office where the protocol was signed. The second part was held immediately after in the Clock Hall and was attended by the representatives of the thirteen powers which ratified.

Von Lersner told the Associated Press correspondent that he had not been appointed a German charge d'affaires in Paris and did not know who would be the first German representative in France.

The Supreme Council today decided that the advent of the League of Nations which is one of the immediate consequences of the exchange of ratifications will take place in Paris Friday, January 16 at 10:30.

(By The Associated Press) PARIS, Jan. 9. The newspapers commenting on the Presidential elections to be held on January 15, agree that Clemenceau will be the next President despite the fact that the Premier has not acknowledged his candidacy forwarded by his friends.

The comment is mostly eulogistic although the extremists are sarcastic.

It was pointed out that it would be the second time in the history of the Republic that a President had been chosen who was not holding office, as, by January 15, Clemenceau will have passed to the ranks of private citizenship. The other instance was the election of Marshal MacMahon, the second President of the Republic.

HOLY NAME SOCIETIES LAUNCH CAMPAIGN TO LIMIT BOLSHEVISM

(By The Associated Press) PITTSBURGH, Jan. 9. — One hundred and forty-five Holy Name Societies of the Roman Catholic Church in the Pittsburgh district have launched a campaign to stop the spread of Bolshevism among wage earners and to further Americanization. Literature intended to establish closer relations between capital and labor is being distributed by the organization.

Rev. Claude Geary, Dominican monk and a leader in the campaign, declared Bolshevism and Socialism can be handled but that problems confronted by capital and labor must be definitely settled to bring peace to the world.

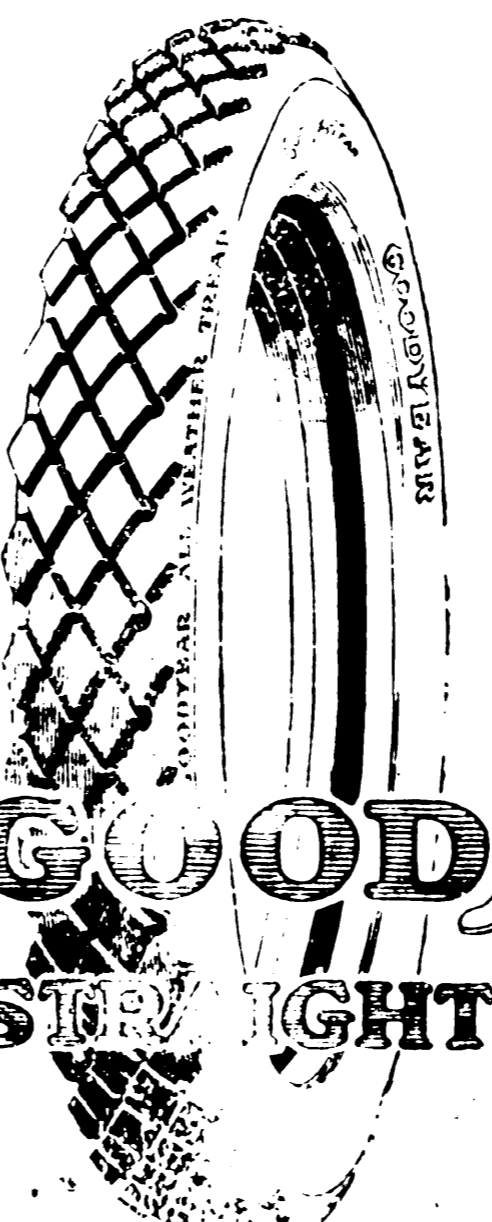

Washington, Enero 9.— El presidente Wilson dedica la mayor parte de su mensaje de "Jackson Day" a explicar por qué considera que los Estados Unidos están en el deber de acudir a la Liga de Naciones, y porque cree que no estará sujeta a guerra hasta que se una. ### EAFUSAHAN A LOS TURCOS

SE HA VUELTO EL CONTROL DE LA CALIFORNIA A LA LEY DE LAS NACIONES

Washington, Enero 9.— Se ha dado información en esta ciudad, anunciando que los aliados están tratando de disuadir al primer ministro de la expulsión de los turcos de Europa sin causar un levantamiento entre los mahometanos, lo que podría poner en peligro la autoridad que ejercen sobre el resto de las naciones musulmanas. Se anuncia que hasta con la guerra se expresa al jefe de la delegación de Gans, Etiopía.

Una de las propuestas que se presentará al Consejo de la Liga de Naciones, es el de establecer un control sobre los productos de la industria de guerra, y dejarlos a la disposición en manos de una comisión compuesta por las potencias aliadas y turcas de la India, Etiopía y Manchuria y proponiendo de Malaya y de las Filipinas. Se se propone a los Estados Unidos a participar hasta su punto. Según este plan, el Sultan permanecerá en Constantinopla y ejercerá plenos poderes como jefe de la iglesia mahometana, en situación semejante a la del Papa de la Iglesia Católica. Este plan es el que se está considerando actualmente.

Paris, Enero 10.— El Tratado de Paz entre Alemania y Francia, la Gran Bretaña, Italia, Egipto y las otras naciones que ratificaron el Tratado de Paz de Versalles, entró en vigencia esta tarde a las 11.16.

Los actores principales que debían participar en la escena final de la labor larga y difícil de hacer la paz, comenzaron a llegar al Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores poco antes de las dos de la tarde y eran saludados por una gran multitud de espectadores. Heer von Lersner, jefe de la delegación alemana, y von Simon, se encontraron entre los últimos en llegar. Entraron al edificio de paz de Clemenceau quien, como el asistente, recibió una ovación cuando bajó de su automóvil.

Los delegados se reunieron en la oficina particular del Ministro de Relaciones Exteriores donde se celebró una sesión secreta durante la cual se firmó el protocolo a las 4.09 p.m.

Los representantes de los poderes principales y Polonia, después de firmar la ratificación y el protocolo, las negociaciones, firmaron también la ratificación del tratado para la protección de los minoritarios polacos.
