

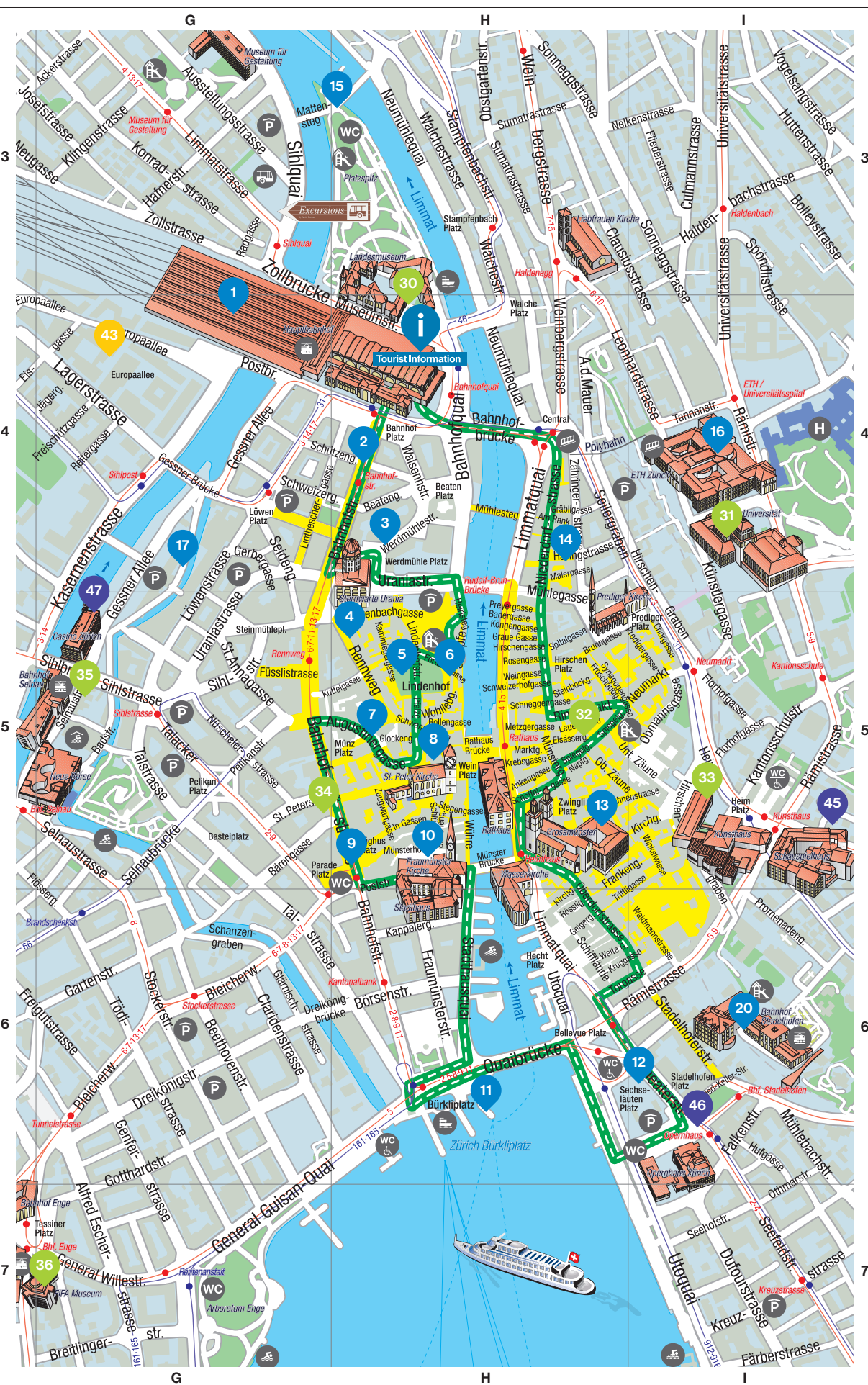

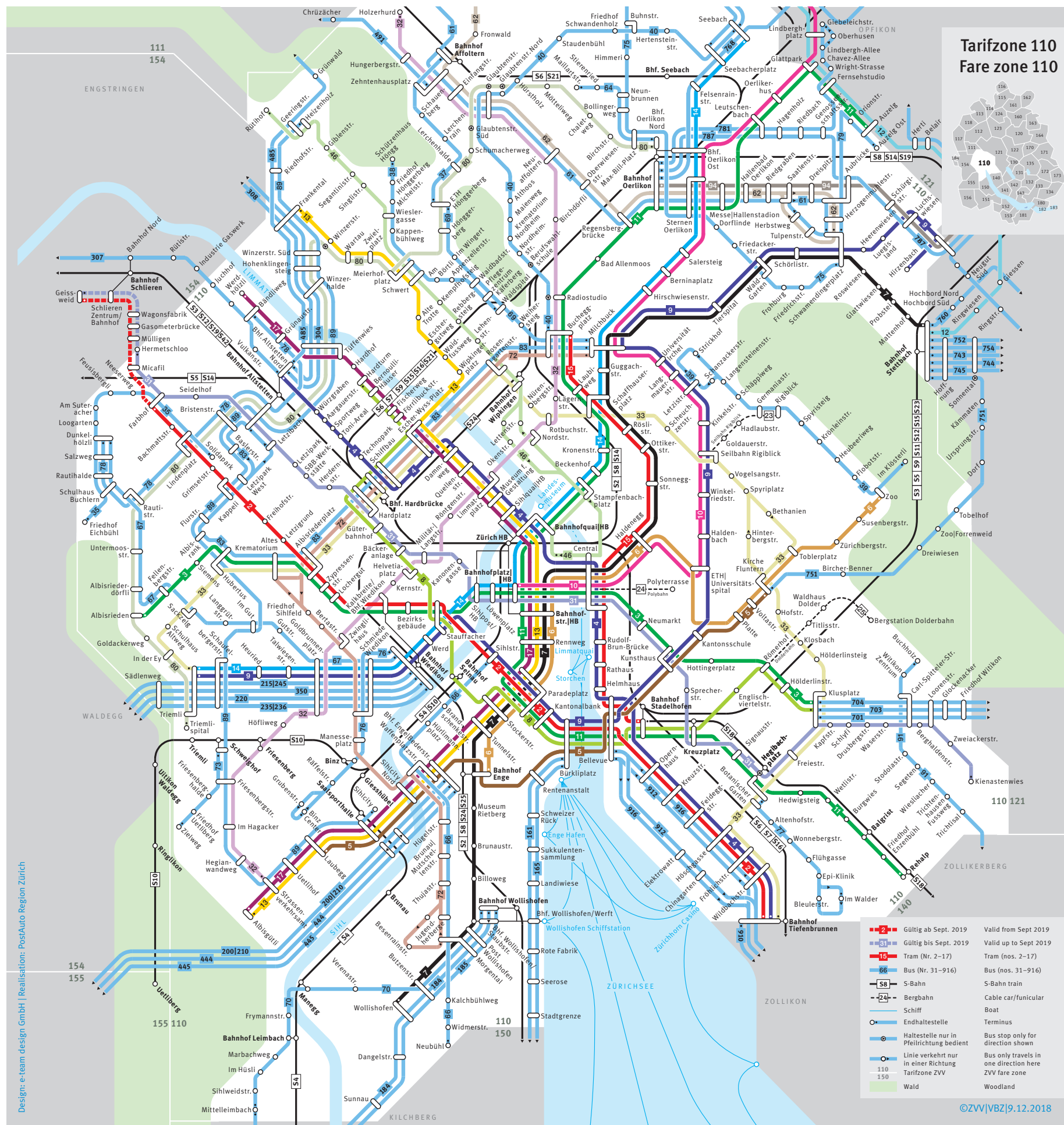

Walking Tour of the Old Town

Shopping on Bahnhofstrasse, great views over the city from Lindenhof, a glimpse of St. Peter's Church, on via Paradeplatz to the Fraumünster with its famous Chagall windows, a quick detour to the lake, then by the Opera House and Grossmünster through the Old Town and back to the Main Station - a short trip around Zurich.

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Highlights

Attractions, museums

Bahnhofstrasse

The world-famous shopping mile was built on the site where the city's fortified moat stood 150 years ago. Along a mile (1.6 km) in length, it links the Main Station with Lake Zurich. Here, department stores, boutiques and jewelry shops can be found. More than 100 shops. The farther you walk towards the lake, the more exclusive the stores become. The heart of the Bahnhofstrasse is the world-famous financial center, Paradeplatz.

Lindenhof

From Lindenhof, situated in the very heart of the city's historical quarter, you can enjoy a magnificent view of the Limmat and the Old Town on the right bank of the river. From the 4th century right through to the early Middle Ages, a Roman fort stood here. Now, the square is a haven of peace and relaxation, a venue for events of all kinds, and a meeting place for keen chess players.

St. Peter's Church

St. Peter's Church is the oldest parish church in Zurich. The original foundation walls dating from the 9th century can still be seen under the chancel. The city's first mayor, Rudolf Brun, acquired St. Peter's in 1348, along with all the associated privileges and obligations. His grave and monument can be found by the outer tower wall. The clock face on the tower measures 28.5 ft (8.7 m) in diameter. The tower's five bells date back to 1850 and the largest weighs over 6.6 tons (6,000 kg) without its clapper.

Fraumünster

This church with a former convent was founded in 853 AD by King Louis the German. After the Reformation, converted into a parish church of Zurich. The church's most important decorative features are its stained glass windows. The north windows are by Augusto Giacometti. The five-part cycle in the choir and the rose in the southern transept are the work of Marc Chagall. There is also a series of frescoes by Paul Bodmer in the cloister.

Bürkliplatz

In the summer, inline skaters, bathers, market vendors and street artists gather around the lower lake basin. Fairs and festivals are also held in winter. The lakefront promenade offers superb views of the snow-capped Alps. It is a popular place for a stroll. Roasted chestnuts and hot chocolate or mulled wine keep stomachs and hands warm. Numerous boats offering lovely views of the Glarner Alps, are moored at Bürkliplatz all year round.

Grossmünster

According to legend, Charlemagne discovered the graves of Zurich's patron saints, Felix and Regula, 150 years ago. In the 16th century, Huldrych Zwingli initiated the Reformation in German-speaking Switzerland from the Grossmünster. More than 187 steps lead up to the viewing platform at the top of the Karlsturm tower. Other highlights include the two windows by Sigmar Polke and the crypt dating from 1107 AD (the oldest room in the city).

Niederdorf and Oberdorf

The Niederdorf is part of Zurich's Old Town and stretches along the right bank of the Limmat. Similarly to Limmatquai, which runs parallel, it is a pedestrian zone. During the day, the many little stores and boutiques tucked away in the narrow side streets invite passersby to browse. In the evening, the Niederdorf is transformed into a nightlife district, catering for a varied public with its many bars, restaurants and street artists.

Zürich-West

The district where once ships were built and engines bolted together is now a focal point of art, design, gastronomy, nightlife, shopping and architecture. Factories have moved away, leaving behind them vast spaces. The light through these creative minds have put to good use. Under the arches of the old Letten railway viaduct, design boutiques and an indoor market have taken up residence, while clubs rub shoulders with trendy bars and restaurants.

Uetliberg

The Uetliberg rises high above the city's rooftops to an altitude of 2,857 ft (871 m) above sea level. From the top, visitors can enjoy spectacular panoramic views of the city and lake, with the snow-capped Alps in the distance. In summer, the Uetliberg is a departure point for hikes and mountain biking. In winter, the trails serve as toboggan runs. It takes just 20 minutes to reach Uetliberg from Zurich Main Station with S-Bahn 10. The train runs every half hour from platform 21/22.

Swiss Finance Museum

What does a stockbroker do? When was the first Swiss cash machine introduced and how does an initial public offering work? In a multimedia exhibition, the museum answers all these questions and offers an extensive insight into the Swiss financial world. The history of the economic system is explained in a fun and entertaining way. One of the world's most important collections of securities also illustrates the development of the financial sector.

Museum of Design

Switzerland's leading museum for design and visual communication showcases significant moments in the history of design in Switzerland and abroad. In two locations: the original location on Aussersihlstrasse - the building itself is an icon of modern architecture - houses temporary exhibitions, while the exhibition area at the Toni-Areal displays four collections of classics from design, graphics, applied art, and poster art.

National Museum Zurich

Always worth a visit: the spectacular 100-year-old building, which is reminiscent of a fairytale castle, houses the largest collection of cultural history artefacts in Switzerland. Temporary exhibitions on socially relevant topics are held several times a year. These include an annual exhibition of works by the winners of the Swiss Press Photo award.

Kunsthaus Zurich

The Kunsthaus Zurich museum of fine art houses the most important collection of modern art in Zurich and one of the most significant art collections in Switzerland, dating from the 18th century right through to the present day. Highlights include works by Picasso, Monet, Munch, Hodder and Warhol. However, the art museum is renowned not only for its permanent art collection, but also for its high-caliber temporary exhibitions.

FIFA World Football Museum

The new FIFA World Football Museum, built in 2016, is a football adventure world for young and old. In addition to the original FIFA World Cup™ Trophy, the museum offers more than 1,000 exclusive exhibits through an interactive multimedia display. The history of football, the national jerseys of all FIFA members and an oversized pinball machine are just some of the highlights to be discovered and enjoyed here.

Museum Rietberg

Museum Rietberg is the only art museum in Switzerland devoted to non-European cultures. It has an internationally renowned collection of works of art from Africa, the Americas and Oceania. The museum's objective in displaying these works of art is to promote understanding of different world cultures, ideologies and religions. The adjoining Rietbergpark, offering beautiful views of the Glarner Alps, invites visitors to stop and linger.

The route along the Limmatquai is lined with historic guild houses next to Lake Zurich, where - when the weather is clear - the view is crowned by the Alps. An audioguide system provides a comprehensive commentary on Zurich's history, culture and attractions.

City Tour and Felsenegg Cable Car Trip

Discover Zurich's Old Town, Bahnhofstrasse, the guild houses on the Limmatquai and more of Zurich's biggest sights during the guided bus tour. On the subsequent journey through the surrounding area, you will experience a ferry ride across Lake Zurich and hop on a cable car in Adliswil that will carry you up to Felsenegg, a popular destination with wonderful views over the city, the lake and the snow-capped Alps.

Zürich Card

The ideal ticket for culture fans and city explorers: the Zürich Card is available for either 24 or 72 hours and provides free second-class travel with the tram, bus, train, boat and cable car, as well as plenty more discounts and free entries, e.g. to museums. It gives a 50% discount on the walking tour through Zurich's Old Town. The Zürich Card can be purchased from Tourist Information or from any ZVV or SBB ticket machine.

Souvenirs at Tourist Information

Parking in Zurich

If you are traveling by car, whether your own or rented, you will need to find parking. Zurich city center has 10 car parks. Public parking spaces with a parking meter are marked in white for short stays of between 30 minutes and four hours (white zones). The areas marked in blue are reserved for residents with a parking permit.

Green Marathon

The Green Marathon gives sports enthusiasts the chance to run 26 miles (42 km) through the city - whenever they like and at their own pace. The overall route leads once around the whole city, but it can also be run in sections. Green signs labeled with icons mark the route. Arrivals and Departures from Zurich Airport

Zurich Airport is only about 6 miles (10 km) from the city center and can be easily reached by train or tram. The journey takes 10 to 15 minutes by train or S-Bahn, and 30 minutes by tram from the airport to the city center is included in the Zürich Card.
