

By his letter to all the Major Superiors dated 15 January 2021, **Father General** has convoked the 71st Congregation of Procurators, to be held in Loyola, Spain, beginning from 16th of May 2022. Its theme is "To See All Things New in Christ". Before the Congregation, from the 7th of May until the evening of 15th May, the Spiritual Exercises will be held in the same place. All the participants (Procurators and Relators) are asked to take part in these Exercises.

Father General has also given this directive: "To begin preparing for the Congregation of Procurators, each Provincial should summon the Congregation of his Province, which must be concluded by 15 January 2022."

AADI staff and student trainees together organised street plays on Corona in 15 Oorus. AADI was part of a team to prepare a Manifesto for the Tribals of Kerala. An evaluation of our Career Guidance and Information Canter at Agaly was professionally done, and we hope to implement its recommendations. AADI and Lok Manch partners participated in a four-day training on 'Ecological Concerns' virtually organised by ISI, Bangalore. AADI organised four Webinars: on 'Right to Health in New Normal' which was inaugurated by ' Mrs. Lida Jacob IAS; on 'Professional Social Work in a democratic and secular India; on 'Children's Education and Mental Health after Corona' by Mrs Sobha Koshy, former State Chair Person for Children's Commission, and Fr Joye James; and on 'Impact of Social Media on Familiy' by Fr Mathew Aerthavil and Mr. Renjit O, Senior State Cyber Police Chief. XIDE (Xavier Institute of Development Education), JAMTOLIBARI, TRIPURA

We had a wonderful New Year celebration in Jamtoli village which began with the Holy Eucharist. In the first week of January itself the remedial tuition classes and the GDA class resumed. The three month GDA course under the guidance of Sr. Annie Joseph, SJA came to a successful completion on 29 Jan. 20 students from different villages completed the course and are waiting for their placement as nursing assistants in hospitals. XIDE is presently running eight remedial tuition centers in different villages. Four of these centers are in the villages of the tea garden workers who are originally from Iharkhand (Adivasis). The education level of these children is worse than that of the other tribals. The XIDE periodically arranges training programme for the tuition teachers. A Youth Seminar was arranged in the XIDE in which 25 youth participated. Fr Babu Paul and Sch Frangle guided a two-day youth camp at Good Shepherd Parish Church, Kathalcherra.

The registration of the second part of the plot of land is completed. Now, we have 8.5 acres of land in our possession at Bhagavan Nagar for the construction of the proposed St Xavier's School. Fr Anand Pereira and Fr Thomas Mathew from Kohima Region visited the new plot to prepare a master plan for the School campus at Bhagavan Nagar. Fr P. T. Mathew visited the Jesuit community at Jamtoli and spent a few days with us. The parishioners welcomed him after the Mass. He also visited the Jamtoli village, different remedial tuition centers and Koskaupara refugee camp. A Women Empowerment Camp was organized at Thachaibagan village and 35 women participated. Sr. Annie Joseph, SJA and Sr. Sanjuktha, SIA visited different villages which made a positive impact in the non-Catholic villages and the people are very welcoming. The XIDE has sent two girls from Jamtoli village to St. Paul's College Phesama in Nagaland for higher studies. Agartala diocese



has entrusted the new St. Ignatius Loyola Parish, Kailashahar to us Jesuits, and it will be inaugurated on 21 March at Jamtolibari by **Bishop Lumen Monteiro**, CSC. We request your prayers and we welcome you to the inaugural function. *Prangle Xavier*

With the passing away of **Prof Dr John Vattanky, SJ**, on Feb 22, 2012, the Church and the nation has lost an erudite scholar, a passionate lover and a visionary

thinker. His critical or logical mind, coupled with his passionate heart, contributed significantly to a better understanding of the classical Nyaya and Navya-Nyaya schools making them relevant for our times. As a committed and devoted Catholic, he was open to the rich philosophical traditions of India. He interpreted this tradition, deepened it and made it available to contemporary scholars, both Indian and non-Indian, Hindu and non-Hindu.

Fr John Vattanky was born on 03 July 1931 at Palackattumala in Kottayam district of Kerala. After his preliminary studies at Papal Seminary,

Kandy, John joined the Jesuit Novitiate at Kozhikode in 1950. He was ordained a priest in 1963 at St Mary's College Kurseong after his theology studies there. He taught philosophy at S.H. College, Shembaganur for a while before leaving for higher studies. After obtaining M.A. in Oriental Studies from the Oxford University and PhD in Indology from Vienna, he returned to India in 1974. He established the Indology Institute at St Xavier's College, Trivandrum, and as its Director, got immersed in research and writing. Later, in 1982, he shifted the Institute to De Nobili College, Pune rechristening it as Centre for Advanced Indian Studies. He also

served as Professor of Indian Philosophy at Jnana Deepa, Institute of Philosophy and Theology, Pune. In 2012 Fr John shifted his Institute to Kanjirapally in Kerala and continued his research in Indian Philosophy and Oriental Theology. In 2015, he suffered a stroke and became paralyzed and was brought to Christ Hall, Kozhikode where he remained till his death.

The contribution of Fr John Vattanky to studies in Indian Philosophy has been recognized globally. His monumental work is Gangesa's Philosophy of God published in 1984. His other writings include Development of Nyaya Theism (1993), Nyaya Philosophy of Language (1995), and A System of Indian Logic (2003). There are many more academic articles



through which he shared his intellectual height and affective depth with his colleagues. Many would admire him working hard and listening patiently to the

Indian scholars (pandits) and taking painstaking notes regularly and on a daily basis. He had the remarkable stamina for hard and sustained intellectual work. As a teacher he had been a mentor to generations of students, who have been inspired by his wisdom and intellectual acumen.

What guided his philosophical quest and Christian reflection may be summed up in three of his enduring passions: Passion for Indian Philosophy, Rooted in Logic and Love, and Open to Oriental Roots. He was fully convinced of the relevance of classical Indian philosophy. That is why the first festschrift

in his honour was aptly titled An Indian Ending: Rediscovering the Grandeur of Indian Heritage for a Sustainable Future (2013). It was remarkable that his book Gangesa's Philosophy of God was favourably appreciated by Kanchi Sankaracharya, who honoured him specially. A man of deep conviction, faith and devotion, Vattanky had a rigorous and inferential mind for philosophizing, especially the logic of Navya-nyaya system and equally a heart for God and the people. It is no wonder that the second volume in his honour

was titled Logic and Love: Reflecting on Professor John Vattanky's Contribution to Indian Philosophy

and Spirituality. Towards the last phase of his life, he had discovered the depth of Oriental theology and symbolism. After learning Syriac in his old age (2012), he studied the life and writings of St. Ephrem (306-373) and was truly enamored by his symbolic theology, which, he believed, fulfilled his mystical orientation.

Fr John passed away on 22 February 2021 at Christ Hall, Kozhikode, after being bedridden for six long years. He endured the suffering peacefully and never complained about his difficult times. He was ever thankful to his numerous care-takers. May the life and vision of Fr John Vattanky be an inspiration for us as Indian and Christian to be fully human and fully divine!
