Fallon, known as the "Oasis of Nevada," is the county seat of Churchill County, located approximately one hour east of Reno.

Churchill County is one of the nine original counties that were created in 1861 when Nevada was formed from the western lands of the Utah Territory during the Civil War. Officially incorporated in 1908, Fallon is also home to the United States Navy's Top Gun Flight School at Fallon Naval Air Station.

With a population of approximately 9,000, Fallon is known for its agriculture, natural beauty and outdoor recreation. It is surrounded by farms, ranches and the Lahontan Valley wetlands that includes the Stillwater Wildlife Refuge, a birder's paradise. In addition, it is home to nearby Sand Mountain, a natural wonder resulting from the remnants of Prehistoric Lake Lahontan. The dune at Sand Mountain is approximately two miles wide and 600 feet tall and draws visitors from far and wide who enjoy ATV and dirt bike riding, sand boarding, camping and other activities. Fallon is also known for its abundance of special events including the 9/11 Annual Memorial Event, Community Reunion, Concerts in the Park & Parades, Cantaloupe Festival & Country Fair, Spring Wings, and the Fallon Fights. The 3C Event Complex is a large events arena with seating capacity for up to 3,000, ready to host many of Fallon's large events including but not limited to various rodeos, festivals, concerts and more.

Most notably, The City of Fallon takes an active role in remembering 9/11, and holds an observance event each year to honor the first responders and military personnel - as well as the men and women who died as a result of this fateful day.

Among Fallon's other noteworthy attractions and programs are the Churchill Arts Center, the nation's first 9/11 memorial site in the Courtyard behind Fallon City Hall, and the Live Local Fallon program, which encourages local patronage of businesses, events and services.



Parks & Recreation

The City of Fallon has six parks and several historic buildings maintained by the city, including City Hall, the Old Post Office and The Douglass House. The Fallon Municipal Pool is open for outdoor use in the summer.

Oats Park Art Center, operated by the Churchill Arts Council, brings in nationally-touring music acts, acclaimed art exhibits and theatrical performances to the meticulously-restored historic center.

The City-County Gym is designed for indoor court sports such as basketball, volleyball and more. The 12,800-square-foot gym has a hardwood floor and can seat more than 800 spectators. This community gym is open for public use and is available for tournaments and other events on a case-by-case basis. For more information or to schedule gym time or special events, call 775-428-1380. Fallon is also located in a region rich with outdoor recreation. Sand Mountain, a unique 4,795-acre recreation area covered with enormous sand dunes, is less than a half-hour from Fallon and attracts a crowd of off-road vehicle and ATV owners, campers and even sandboarders (a sport similar to snowboarding, only on sand).

In the fall, Fallon is a fertile hunting ground with worldclass waterfowl in numerous nearby wetlands, and chukar and quail in upland areas including the Stillwater National Wildlife Refuge. Larger game including deer, antelope and elk abound in nearby mountains. In the spring, Fallon is a bird watcher's paradise.

In addition, the Churchill County Parks & Recreation Department offers a variety of year-round programs and activities for the whole family. **Call 775-428-1380 for complete details.**

Events

The City of Fallon plays host to a packed calendar of special events ranging from boxing matches to high-speed drag races. Community activities include the New Year's Eve bonfire and fireworks, the city's 4th of July celebration, 9/11 Tribute event, Fallon Christmas Tree Lighting, Santa's Wonderland, Spring Wings Bird Festival, and various performances and exhibits at the Oats Park Art Center, all bringing neighbors together for a tight-knit, family-friendly experience. Many of these larger and well-known regional events also attract visitors from across Nevada and northern California.

Convention & Meeting Space

Fallon is home to a variety of excellent meeting spaces for big and small groups. The Fallon Convention Center, a 6,500-square-foot meeting location, accommodates groups as large as 350 with a complete line of audio/ visual equipment, multimedia projectors, a central sound system, Wi-Fi and DSL Internet connections, and a full kitchen. Additionally, the new 3C Event Complex encompasses an additional square feet of event, meeting, and multi-purpose space for events and rodeos of all kinds, as well as state-of-the-art sound systems and fairground access for expanded large events - enabling an indoor and outdoor capacity for your events.

Unique smaller meeting and event spaces can also be reserved at the Old Post Office, Lattin Farms and the Oats Park Art Center. The City-County Gym also offers 12,800 square feet of flexible space for trade shows, concerts, tournaments and other athletic events.

Fiber optic connectivity to Reno of one gigabyteper-second and T-1 circuit options are also available. Fallon's Internet capabilities are delivered through a Synchronous Optical Network (SONET) ring connecting through Reno to the nation's global telecommunications backbone. The secure, underground, redundant connection ensures reliable, uninterrupted high-speed Internet access.

CC Communications has been upgrading the current Internet infrastructure since 2003, as well as expanding its network. CC Communications also provides data services, VOIP, television security and video surveillance systems.

The Fallon area is part of Nevada Connect, a program funded by the U.S. Department of Commerce NTIA State Broadband Initiative, which has helped CC Communications focus on the needs of small and medium-sized businesses. In fact, Churchill County was the second county in Nevada to become a certified "Connected" community, which includes expanding digital literacy, providing businesses with social media and website assistance, improving local government's online presence and leveraging technology planning in all aspects of economic development.

The City of Fallon has both a 25-bed community hospital and an urgent care center, as well as several private medical practices.

Banner Churchill Community Hospital provides emergency services, obstetrics, orthopedics, a birthing center, surgical services, intensive care, and an infusion center. The hospital also provides a full suite of outpatient services such as medical imaging, occupational health, a laboratory and rehabilitation.

Unique services include an intelligent OB program that uses a computer system to reduce complications during labor and delivery, and Banner iCare that teams on-site medical staff with intensive care specialists through a remote monitoring center.

Western Nevada College-Fallon, provides adult education, occupational training, counseling, manpower services and two-year college programs that are transferable to many other state universities.


Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University's Fallon Center is

Ready-to-build Land For Sale

New River Business Park lots are fully adaptable and customizable. Phase One of the project offers building sites ranging from one to 10+ acres. Sites between one and two acres are offered at approximately \$1.25 per square foot, while lots from two to five acres are approximately \$1 per square foot. Larger projects up to approximately 10 acres may be offered at discounted rates. Final price is determined upon site appraisal.
