### OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT FROM HOST UNIVERSITY WITH ISA COVER LETTER

Upon the successful completion of an ISA program, the student's host university will issue an official transcript that lists all coursework. ISA will send this transcript to the appropriate office at the student's home university. Additionally, ISA will provide a cover letter explaining the host university's grading system and a translation of the transcript, as necessary.

### FULL-TIME RESIDENT STAFF

ISA's full-time resident staff assists students with all aspects of their experience abroad. The resident staff provides support during official course registration and arranges the Bridging Cultures Program, excursions, weekly meetings, cultural activities and much more.

Staff members are trained to ensure the well-being of each program participant and are dedicated to facilitating a positive and meaningful study abroad experience.

### ON-SITE ISA OFFICES

Most program locations have an on-site ISA office with a full-time resident staff. The on-site offices offer students a source of security while abroad by serving as a common meeting place and resource center.

### COMPUTER AND INTERNET ACCESS

ISA students enjoy free internet access at ISA on-site offices and/or computer labs at the host university. ISA is continuing to install wireless internet services at additional program sites.

In the age of globalization, it is becoming increasingly important to gain an intimate understanding of another culture. As you browse through this catalog, we hope that you begin to understand the wide range of programs and services that ISA offers. By opening this catalog, you have shown an eagerness to learn about other cultures. By studying or interning abroad, you will have the opportunity to become part of the local culture and traditions that are unique to your host city and gain a global perspective in the process.

### ORIENTATION AND BRIDGING CULTURES PROGRAM

Prior to departure, all ISA students will go through a comprehensive online orientation. While abroad, our resident staff will conduct the Bridging Cultures Program, which includes a thorough on-site orientation, and will provide support to students during their program. ISA's staff members also provide assistance to students upon their return to the U.S.

### TUTORING

All students participating in ISA's foreign language acquisition programs will have access to tutoring at our on-site offices at no additional cost.

### AIRPORT RECEPTION

Transportation is provided from the airport for students who arrive during the ISA-designated pick-up times. Airport reception is not provided for Intensive Month or J-Term programs.

### HOUSING

Housing is included in the price of all ISA programs, excluding the Pacific region. Accommodations will vary according to program site and session. For more details on ISA's housing options, please refer to the housing chart on pp. 6-8.

### EXCURSIONS

We include organized excursions with all of our programs to complement the academic component of the student's study abroad experience. Excursions are not included for Intensive Month or J-Term programs.

### CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Resident staff will organize unique activities to expose our students to the essence of their host city from a local's point of view.

### MEDICAL INSURANCE

Comprehensive medical insurance is provided during the official dates of the program. Extensions of medical coverage are available for an additional fee if students plan to be abroad before or after the program period. A full description of coverage can be found on the ISA website.

### 24-HOUR EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Emergency assistance is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.








## BRIDGING CULTURES PROGRAM

The Bridging Cultures Program (BCP) encompasses the ISA on-site orientation delivered to all students in the first days of their ISA program, with key improvements in areas related to goal setting, intercultural awareness, diversity and professional development. For a number of reasons, the first days that follow a student’s arrival on site offer us some of the best opportunities to effectively transmit information to program participants. While the pre-departure orientations that students receive from ISA and their home universities are also important, students are typically more ready to focus on their study abroad experience when they arrive at their host country.

The BCP is designed to help ISA make the most of this important opportunity to educate students, and to give students the tools that will facilitate discovery and learning during their program. The BCP is an important introduction to a new culture, home and experience. The BCP is designed to prepare students for a successful, positive and rewarding experience that will influence the rest of their lives.

## ISA DISCOVERY MODEL

A primary objective of all ISA programs is to facilitate the learning and development of students. We rely on host universities to provide quality instruction in the classroom, but ISA is the main facilitator of learning outside of the classroom. Our efforts to promote student learning are shaped by an educational framework we call the ISA Discovery Model. According to this model, student learning and development is organized into five areas of discovery: **1. INTERCULTURAL 2. HISTORICAL 3. SOCIOPOLITICAL 4. PROFESSIONAL 5. ENVIRONMENTAL.** Throughout the duration of all ISA programs, we provide participants opportunities to pursue guided learning in these five areas of discovery through participation in ISA excursions, cultural activities and community involvement.

 <p><b>SOCIOPOLITICAL</b> ISA programs intend for students to be well-informed about the sociopolitical reality of their program location. We strive to educate students so they can intelligently discuss important contemporary events. ISA wants students to articulate how current events impact host country nationals’ views of domestic and U.S. government policies, along with identifying the main domestic media channels and how they align politically and ideologically.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Describe local and national media channels and newspapers to help students understand the political/ideological leanings of various channels from a local perspective.</li> <li>• Send students links to selected news stories and provide opportunities for discussion of the contents. All ISA students have access to a New York Times subscription as a part of their ISA program. We also post these stories on social media sites.</li> <li>• Offer excursions that are directly related to sociopolitical issues, such as our excursion to the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) in South Korea; its very existence has enormous geopolitical implications on trade, international security and regional relations.</li> </ul>
 <p><b>PROFESSIONAL</b> ISA empowers students to use their time abroad as a means to explore their professional and career goals. Students receive the Professional Development Toolbox as a resource prior to departure, during their time abroad and after returning from their program. Our mission is to enable students to intelligently leverage their study, internship or service-learning abroad experience when pursuing post-graduate careers or continuing education.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide access to the Professional Development Toolbox for all ISA participants before, during and after their program. The toolbox, located in the student portal, is a cache of multimedia resources designed to help with practical aspects of the job hunt including résumé and cover letter writing tips, interview coaching and advice for how to effectively market their international experience. The utilization of the resources in the toolbox enables students to better articulate how their international experience has enhanced their skillset and how those transferable skills translate into benefits for their potential employer or post-graduate educational institution.</li> <li>• Encourage students to think about how their international experience will give them a competitive advantage in the job market. We have found that by developing an understanding of their local environment, students feel more comfortable, safe and healthy during their program.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Offer at least one excursion or activity in each location that facilitates the interaction between our students and the natural environment.</li> <li>• Educate students about local resource management procedures. Nearly every ISA office abroad has a recycling program in place, enabling us to promote conservation.</li> <li>• Promote a deeper understanding of the importance of communal spaces, involvement and civic engagement by incorporating a volunteer day as a cultural activity at all ISA sites. During the volunteer day, program participants typically work alongside local residents to beautify a local park or public space.</li> </ul>

## PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT TOOLBOX

The Professional Development Toolbox is a key component of the Professional area of the ISA Discovery Model and is available in the online orientation section of the student portal. From the start of your program through your re-entry process, the resources available in this toolbox will help you to identify the skills and key competencies that you have acquired through your international, academic and personal experiences. Our goal is to empower you to leverage your international

experience to differentiate yourself from other graduates. The ability to articulate the value of your international experience is a skill. This toolbox will help you communicate the transferable skills in a way that shows your potential employer or post-grad university the concrete benefits you have gained as a direct result of your experience abroad.

## ISA'S COMMITMENT TO EDUCATION

ISA's mission is to provide high-quality education abroad opportunities to U.S. and Canadian university students at an affordable price. Our programs are designed to maximize our participants' learning. We understand that most university students need support and expert guidance before, during and after their time abroad. ISA is a Global Associate of NAFSA: Association of International Educators, a charter member of the Forum on Education Abroad and adheres to the professional standards and ethics set forth by these organizations.

### HOST INSTITUTIONS AND ACADEMIC SPONSORS

ISA partners with host institutions that are accredited or recognized by a legitimate accrediting agency, a higher education association, the Holy See (for pontifical schools) or other authoritative bodies, such as a host country's Ministry of Education. Students who complete an ISA program receive an academic transcript from their host institution or from a university serving as an ISA academic sponsor or school of record for select study centers.

With nearly 70 locations throughout the world, ISA gives students the ability to choose from an extraordinary range of academic settings, campus cultures and extracurricular resources. Common to all of ISA's programs, however, is a commitment to academic excellence and to helping ISA students maximize their learning in and out of the classroom.

### HOST PARTNERSHIPS

Our U.S. staff is dedicated to addressing the questions and concerns of advisors and faculty members at U.S. and Canadian universities sending students on our programs. Additionally, ISA Resident Directors work tirelessly to ensure that we maintain strong relationships with the host institutions receiving our students.

These relationships allow students to have a smooth transition into life at a university abroad and facilitate the resolution of academic issues that may arise.

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT TEAM AND RESOURCES

Our U.S. advisors help students find the program that best fits their academic needs and goals. ISA's website also provides a wealth of information pertaining to academics, including course and university descriptions.

Most of our resident staff members hold advanced degrees or have worked either as instructors or university support staff. At all sites, ISA provides tutoring services to students enrolled in language courses. Upon completion of the program, the ISA staff in the U.S. is ready to provide support during the re-entry process. Students can visit the alumni section of the ISA website for information about credit transfer, requesting additional transcripts and the Global Ambassador Program.

### ISA DISCOVERY MODEL

ISA provides students with valuable academic opportunities both inside and outside the classroom to maximize their education abroad. By offering program orientations, homestays with local families, cultural activities, excursions and language exchanges, we are able to enhance the learning that takes place in the classroom in the areas of intercultural, historical, sociopolitical, professional and environmental discovery.

### ISA INTERNSHIPS & SERVICE-LEARNING

Internships are customized to meet the participant's individual goals for professional development. Résumé and cover letter advising contribute to professional growth and highlight transferable skills. Participants may be able to receive academic credit through Carroll College. Programs are available in Australia, Chile, China, England, Ireland, New Zealand, South Korea and Spain.

Service-learning is designed to meet the needs of the local community while developing skills relevant to the participant's field of study. Critical reflections and group discussions contribute to personal growth and enhanced cultural competency. Participants may be

able to receive academic credit through Carroll College. Programs are available in Chile, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, India, Ireland, Jordan, Morocco, Peru and South Africa.

### TRANSFER CREDIT

At the time of application, ISA asks that all students receive academic approval from an advisor at their home institution. We advise students of the importance of meeting their universities' internal requirements for studying abroad and of receiving pre-approval for the classes they plan to take while on an ISA program. To simplify this approval process, our website provides course information including contact hours and course descriptions, and our advisors are available to answer questions.

After the program has concluded, ISA sends an official transcript from the host institution to the student's home university, along with a cover letter that translates the course titles, as necessary, and provides a suggested grade conversion scale.

### FORUM ON EDUCATION ABROAD RECOGNITION

ISA successfully participated in the Forum on Education Abroad Quality Improvement Program (QUIP) for our academic programs in Granada, Spain. ISA is one of only a few institutions that has volunteered for this outside review to receive an impartial, independent assessment of our programs by professionals in the field, overseen by the Forum on Education Abroad.

This group determined that ISA Granada programs meet all the requirements for recognition by the Forum for their adherence to the Standards of Good Practice, meaning that the assessed programs maintain a commitment and dedication both to offering high quality programs in education abroad at a level of excellence sought by the larger academic community, and to continuous assessment and improvement.

## Academic Advisory Board

The ISA Advisory Board serves as a means to better understand and respond to the needs of the institutions and students we serve. The board advises ISA management on a wide range of matters including risk management, curriculum integration, outcomes assessment and website design.

The advice and direction provided by the board over the years has greatly helped ISA attain its position of leadership in the field of international education.

## ISA'S COMMITMENT TO STUDENT HEALTH, SAFETY AND SECURITY

All efforts are made to ensure the safety, security and well-being of our students throughout the duration of their programs.

While ISA cannot guarantee a risk-free environment, we follow prudent measures to reduce risk and provide the safest environment for study abroad program participants.

### STUDENT HEALTH

Prior to departure, students submit a medical history form so that ISA staff can be prepared to accommodate any health concerns. The ISA resident staff is trained and equipped to help students receive quality medical care in the event of illness or injury.

ISA provides students with various forms to encourage students to address any concerns they may have with their healthcare providers, family and support system so they may be able to manage any condition while abroad.

### CODE OF CONDUCT

Our code of conduct establishes clear guidelines designed to empower students to behave in a manner that decreases their risk and enriches their experience. Violations are immediately addressed by resident staff and communicated to the students' home universities.

### MEDICAL INSURANCE

Comprehensive medical insurance is included in the program price and covers the student for the official on-site period of the program. Detailed information about medical insurance can be found in the admissions section of the ISA website.

### GLOBAL AWARENESS

The ISA resident staff is in close contact with the U.S. Embassy in each program country and is ready to respond to crises. ISA also closely monitors the information and guidelines set forth by the U.S. Department of State, OSAC and on-site experts and will support students throughout the process of returning to the U.S. if evacuation is warranted.

### RISK MANAGEMENT

No activity is risk-free; however, study abroad programs may involve unique risks to participants. ISA and our U.S. department of Health, Safety & Security are committed to providing a safe and secure learning environment. Meanwhile, ISA resident directors provide support in-country throughout the program. Resident directors and our U.S.-based staff provide information, guidance and advice during the program as well as an immediate response and support during emergencies.

### ISA ON-CALL

While abroad, students can contact a member of their resident staff at any time. The ISA resident staff is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to help any student in the event of an emergency.

ISA also has staff on-call at all times in the U.S. Students, parents and home university staff who need urgent assistance outside of regular office hours can call the ISA office in Austin at (512) 480-8522 to access emergency contact information.

### ACCOMMODATING STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Our site specialists, admissions staff and resident directors work together to advise students on appropriate locations that meet each student's needs, regardless of what the student's situation might be. Additionally, our staff works in conjunction with students' home institutions' study abroad offices and departments for students with disabilities in an effort to collaborate on pre-departure advising and preparation for abroad opportunities. We believe that all students should have the opportunity to study abroad and that unique circumstances should not prevent them from pursuing this opportunity.

### ISA BRIDGING CULTURES PROGRAM

Upon arrival at each ISA location, our Resident Directors provide the Bridging Cultures Program (BCP) which includes an on-site orientation that informs students about academics, health and safety, housing, transportation and money. The BCP also includes a brief introduction to local culture and

history, suggestions for adjusting to life abroad and details about what to expect from daily life as a foreign student.

Clear, concrete and emphatic information concerning health and safety is first and foremost on the resident staff's checklist for orientations and on-site follow-up meetings. Students at any ISA site throughout the world are given a card upon arrival with emergency phone numbers including local hospitals, police, fire, taxi and the cell phone numbers of Resident Directors. During the meetings that occur upon arrival to a program site, students are given extensive information about the kinds of dangers that tourists and foreign students typically face in the host country.

**DORM**

Dorm-style living is similar to the U.S. and is located on or near the host university. Participants will share the living and bath area and have individual or shared rooms. Meal plans are included. The number of students per room varies by site; access to internet, laundry and kitchen facilities varies by site. Some dorms have curfews. A security deposit is required for all locations. ISA may keep all, or a portion of, the deposit in the event of damages or excessive utility charges at the property. Please contact ISA if you have any questions.

**APARTMENT**

Apartments are fully furnished, have a fully equipped kitchen, and are either on campus or are conveniently located near public transit. Most apartments include suite-style living where participants share the living and bath areas but have individual or shared rooms. Internet access varies by site. A security deposit is required for all locations. ISA may keep all, or a portion of, the deposit in the event of damages or excessive utility charges at the property. Please contact ISA if you have any questions.

**INDEPENDENT HOUSING**

With the exception of Fiji, students have the option to refuse ISA housing and secure their housing independently. Students who select this option will not be charged housing fees by ISA. By choosing to opt out of ISA housing, the student is solely responsible for researching, reserving and paying all fees, deposits and rent directly to the housing facility chosen. Independent Housing in Australia and New Zealand can be difficult to secure as a year lease is standard. If a student selects the Independent Housing option and is unable to find accommodation, ISA may not be able to provide housing for the student if all housing due dates have passed.

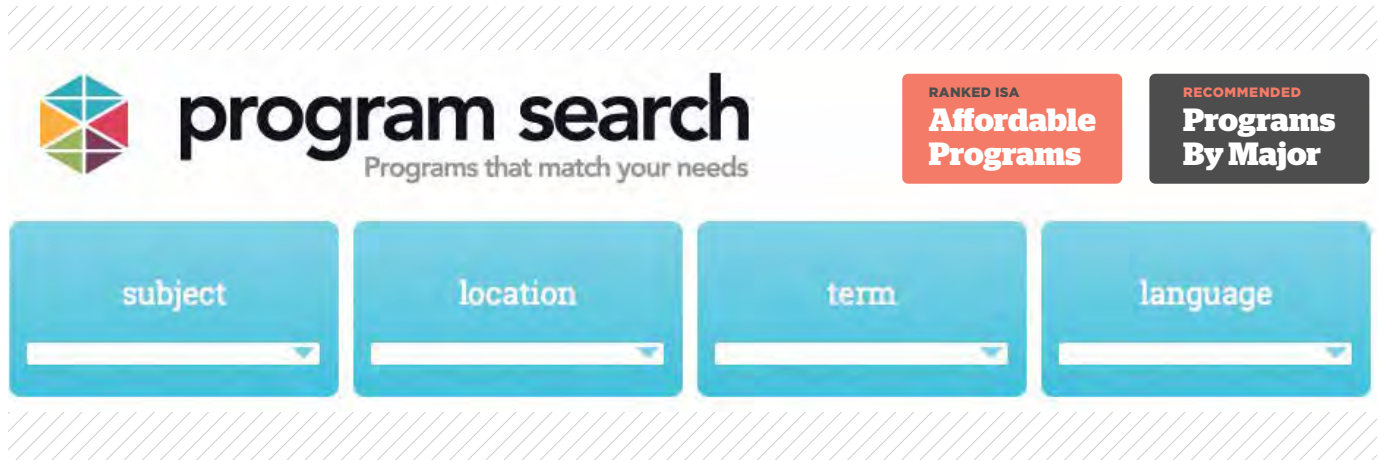

In the vast majority of cases, ISA host universities are recognized by the host country's ministry of education (or equivalent), and in some instances recognition is through a U.S.-based accreditation agency.

In addition to a university's institution-wide accreditation, individual departments or academic units (such as Business and Engineering) can have specialized accreditation.

**BUSINESS**

**AACSB**  
**The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB)** grants internationally recognized, specialized accreditation to bachelor, master and doctoral level business and accounting programs. AACSB Accreditation standards encourage post-secondary educators to seek academic excellence and promote progressive improvement within their business and/or accounting programs. AACSB Accreditation is recognized across the globe as the oldest form of specialized accreditation that an institution and its business/accounting programs can obtain.

**EQUIS**  
**The European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS)** provides internationally recognized accreditation for institutions that exhibit an overall high quality in all areas of their educational activities, while specifically focusing on the institutions' internationalization initiatives and abilities. The accreditation criteria arose from a need to recognize those institutions that have specialized in cross-border business initiatives and global alliances, in order to best deliver quality tertiary education in the areas of international relations, business and management.


**AMBA**  
**The Association of MBAs (AMBA)** accredits MBA, DBA and MBM programs at around 200 business schools in over 80 countries. 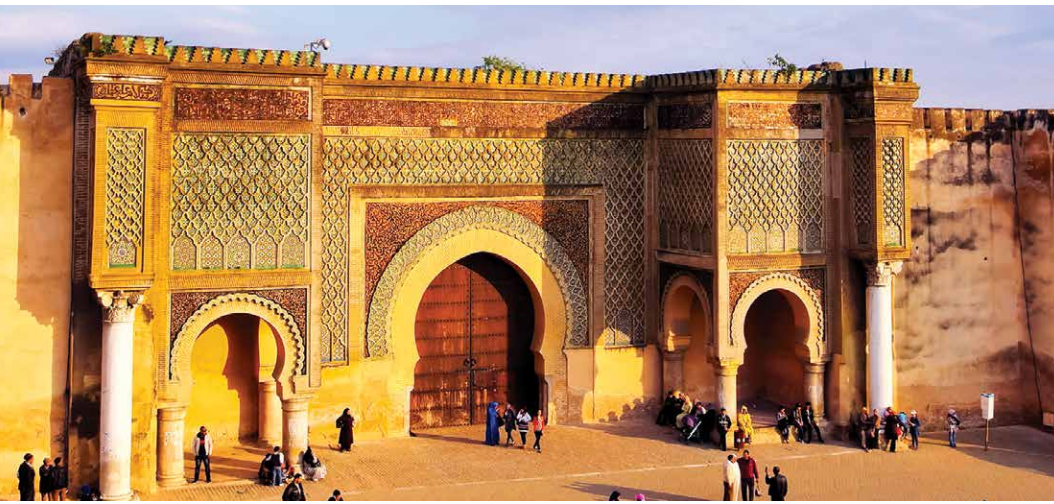

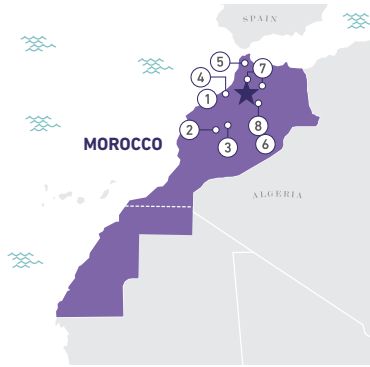

## Intercultural

The Moroccan cultural tapestry is a unique blend of Arab, Amazigh, Jewish and French traditions. While in Meknes, ISA students will have the opportunity to celebrate local holidays and participate in religious fasts and feasts such as Ramadan.

During the holy month of Ramadan, ISA students can choose to fast from fajr (sunrise) prayer to maghrib (sunset) prayer alongside their Moroccan friends and host families. Ramadan seeks to remind Muslims to appreciate all that they have and helps Muslims to understand the plight of the poor. Suhoor (breakfast) is eaten just before sunrise and typically consists of eggs, sweet pastries and harira. Ftoor (dinner) is eaten just after sundown and typically consists of traditional Moroccan dishes such as tagine and couscous. If you are lucky enough to study abroad in Morocco during Ramadan, you will more than likely be invited over for a fantastic, homemade ftoor. Food is an essential part of Moroccan culture, and Moroccans love to share their culture with ISA students!

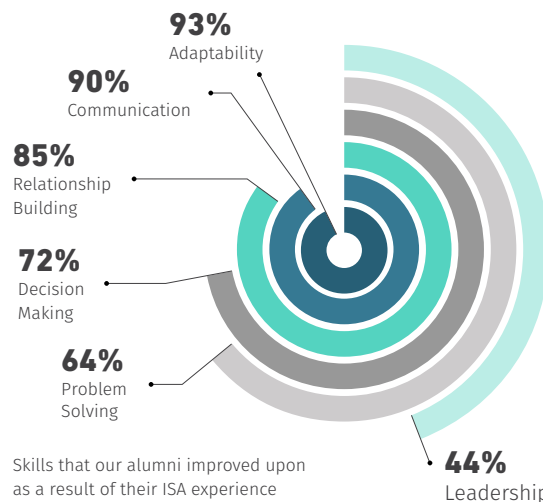

# ISA ALUMNI SURVEY RESULTS

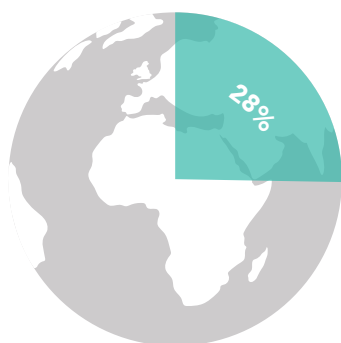

Over 89% of ISA Alumni graduated in 4 years or less, compared to 36% of students who graduated from U.S. flagship universities\*

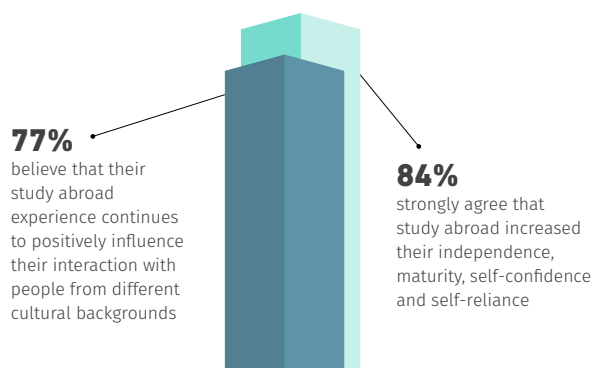

## APPLICATION & ADMISSION PROCESS

ISA accepts students on a rolling basis, so applications should be submitted as soon as possible. Check the application due date on the ISA website for the program of your choice and submit your application accordingly. **Due to high enrollment, ISA recommends submitting applications at least one to two months before the application due date.**

Once you are accepted, you will be required to submit completed paperwork from the student portal and full payment by your program's final forms and payment due date, found on the ISA website.

### Meet The Minimum Requirements

- Please refer to the ISA catalog or website for the enrollment requirements for your program of interest.
- Ensure that you know application deadlines and are applying prior to your program's deadline. Applications for back to back programs are due by the earliest session's due date.
- Minimum GPA requirements range from 2.50 to 3.50.
- Applicants must be enrolled at a college or high school at the time of application for most programs.
- When applicable, students must also meet the minimum language requirement.

The deposit is non-refundable once your application has been submitted. However, if your application is denied due to eligibility requirements, your deposit will be refunded. The deposit will be applied toward the full program price and may be paid by check or credit card.

ISA accepts Visa, Mastercard and Discover. If writing a check, please make checks payable to International Studies Abroad or ISA.

- **Please note:** Certain programs in Costa Rica, Czech Republic, Dominican Republic, England, Ireland, Japan, Scotland, South Africa, South Korea, Thailand and FSU Partnership programs require additional application materials.

## STUDENT VISA INFORMATION

ISA program countries vary greatly in their visa requirements for students. While some participants may be required to obtain a student visa, others may be able to stay in the host country for the duration of their program as a tourist. The application process for a student visa also varies by country. Depending on the foreign consulate, applicants may have to apply for the visa in person, via an online application or by mailing in all application materials. ISA will include country-specific student visa information in the student portal (when applicable).

Most countries require a background check to issue a student visa, and any current or unresolved legal matters may result in a visa application being denied. If you have a current or unresolved legal matter or have not completed all sanctions from a legal matter, contact the consulate directly right away to obtain more information.

Please refer to the Embassies and Consulates Section of the ISA website to find consulate and relevant student visa requirements.

Does the program organize **on-site local activities, like the ISA Discovery Model** that expose participants to the culture?

Will the program conduct a **comprehensive Bridging Cultures Program orientation on-site**?

While abroad, will the program have **24-hour emergency crisis support** from a full-time resident staff?

Does the program provide **comprehensive insurance**? What does your insurance include that others do not?

Are **housing and meals included** in the price of the program?

Does the program offer **laundry service** or at the very least laundry facilities?

Does the program promise a **transcript from the host university** upon the successful completion of the academic courses?

Does the program offer **free career advising tools** for how to market your study abroad experience?
