Other LGUs impose same policy amid EV's soaring COVID-19 cases

No vax card, no entry now imposed in Tacloban

TACLOBAN CITY- As this regional capital of Eastern Visayas now under Alert Level 3 beginning Friday (Jan.14), its cases of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) continue to soar in huge numbers.

On Friday, the city logged 128 new cases, a record for the city since the pandemic started in 2020.

Its total cases are now at 453, a figure covering just of the current month.

City Mayor Alfred Romualdez, in a move to address the soaring number of COVID-19 cases of the city, issued an executive order on Thursday, which among others, prohibits unvaccinated individuals to enter any commercial or business establishments.

The same Executive Order 2022-01-001 issued by Romualdez, non-residents of the city who are planning to enter Tacloban but are not fully vaccinated need to present either a negative RT-PCR

test administered within 72 hours or a negative antigen test administered within 24 hours to their arrival to the city.

The same directive of the city mayor has formalized the use of the vaccination card as a pass for one to enter government offices and commercial establishments.

It also encourages government offices to adopt a work-from-home or other flexible working arrangement.

Residents of the tourist site of Dawahon ask for help after its seaweed production was washed out due to 'Odette'

BATO, Leyte- Residents of Dawahon village of this town are appealing for help for them recover their livelihood that was destroyed by typhoon 'Odette'.

Dawahon, known as one of the best diving sites in the country, is located in a reef in between Leyte and Bohol provinces, and more than an hour travel away from the town proper of Bato town.

Residents of this small island village, which has a population of more than 3,200, rely on seaweed production aside from traditional fishing.

The Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) has estimated that around P200 million was destroyed in the village consisting of seaweed farms, post-harvest facilities, and fishing boats.

"We appeal to all national and local government agencies to help us recover our livelihood so that our fishermen can return back to their source of income," Arnulfo Taneo, the village chairman of Dawahon.

The villagers are also recipients of 900 fiberglass paddle boats from the BFAR but only less than 20 remain after the devastation of Odette.

Taneo said that although they already received food packs and other relief goods from government agencies and private groups, this is not sustainable unlike having their livelihood restored.

In response to this call, BFAR, through its seaweed development program, coordinated with seaweeds farmers in Dawahon on the possible and feasible immediate assistance that the office can provide.

Seaweed propagules are set to be delivered within the month to revive the seaweed farms on the island, while seaweed culture materials and other relevant assistance are deemed to be given upon provision of appropriate funding from the national government.

Of the 770 households in the village, a total of 742 were totally damaged while 28 were partially damaged. Most of the totally damaged houses are located along the shoreline.

Bill authored by Rep. Daza signed into law by Pres. Duterte simplifying adoption process

CATARMAN, Northern Samar- President Rodrigo Duterte signed into law a bill principally authored by Northern Samar Rep. Paul Daza (1st district) simplifying the adoption process.

The President signed RA 11642 otherwise known as the Act of Strengthening the Domestic Adoption Law on January 6 that aims to simplify the adoption process across the country.

Under the new law, specifics have been set from the national down to regional child care offices to decide petitions for adoption and as well in facilitating documents.

Northern Samar now out from the list of poorest provinces

CATARMAN, Northern Samar-The province of Northern Samar liberated itself from being one of the poorest provinces as it now ranked 35th from among the 81 provinces of the country.

This was learned from Engr. Romeo Cardenas, provincial planning and development officer in a radio interview hosted by the Philippine Information Agency Northern Samar.

Comparatively, the province recorded 61.6% poverty incidence among population in Northern Samar in 2015 and it dropped to 31% in 2021 based on the official poverty statistics released by the Philippine Statistics Authority.

"This proved that we are on the right track because of the delivery and consistent efforts by the provincial government," said Cardenas.

"Mainly, we attribute this win to the leadership of the present governor Edwin Ongchuan as he was able to rally the whole province behind him which led us out from Club 20, the united efforts and cooperation of LGUs and different sectors, we were not hardly hit by calamity or disaster and the improving peace and order situation with the assistance of the national government through the ELCAC," Cardenas explained.

Also, since 2016, the provincial government has pumped prime the economy, investment and infrastructure, aside from the assistance of the national government like the PAMANA, PRDP and the like.

Institutional reforms and clustering approach also made way to the progress of the province where services and efforts were clustered into four: Human Development and Poverty Alleviation, Food Security and Sustainable Economic Development, Peace and Resilience and Good Governance and Institutional Development.

The clear vision of the province "Nortehanon, Marig-on Mainuswagon, Malipayon," which is known to a Nortehanon made one conscious and aware of where the provincial government is leading to, Cardenas said.

Tadefa replaces Col. Arnel Apud who was assigned at the national headquarter of the Philippine National Police at Camp Crame.

Pastor killed in Leyte post-typhoon road clearing

TACLOBAN CITY - An elderly pastor was killed on Monday when hit by a falling coconut tree during a post-typhoon roadside clearing operation in Matalom, Leyte.


Police identified the victim as Rizacion Ybañez, 63, of the Philippine Independent Catholic Church, and resident of Sta. Fe village in Matalom town.

Matalom police station investigator, Staff Sgt. David Santiago, Jr., said in a phone interview Tuesday

that the victim was driving a single motorcycle when asked to stop for a few minutes since someone was cutting a coconut tree partially damaged by Typhoon Odette.

"All vehicles were flagged down by personnel involved in clearing operations, but when Ybañez noticed that two motorcycle riders insisted to pass by, he followed them, but unfortunately, he failed to escape from the falling tree,"



Inmate escaped using vehicle hired by live-in partner

TACLOBAN CITY- An inmate is now being hunted down after he escaped using a van purportedly hired by her live-in partner on Tuesday morning.

The prisoner, Byron Murillo, 39 and charged for strings of estafa cases, was on his way, together with his escorts, among them was Prison Guard 1 Remigio Murillo, said to be an

uncle of the inmate, from the Justice Hall building, this city at around 11 am as the scheduled court hearing of Byron was canceled.

While he was being escorted outside the building, the live-in partner of the inmate, Ana Maria Gatela, approached them and asked that they be given time to talk.

The inmate and his live-

in partner went inside a white van, said to have been hired by Gatela. And while the two were inside the van, Murillo drove the vehicle and punched Gatela who reportedly asked him to stop the vehicle, report from the regional headquarters of the Philippine National Police (PNP) based in Palo town, Leyte, said.

The same report said

that Murillo directed his live-in partner to disembark along Eastern Visayas Medical Center, which is just less than a kilometer away from the Justice Building.

The vehicle used by Murillo was later seen abandoned at Jones Street, also this city.

Rights vs. safety

Some concerned citizens are expressing their sentiments over what they claim as inconsistencies of government policies in the implementation of health protocols in the face of the coronavirus pandemic. These protests are all over social media.

It can be recalled that under RA 11525 approved by the President on February 26, 2021, the government as stipulated in Sec. 2 recognizes the experimental nature of COVID-19 vaccine and, as such, Sec. 12 states that "...the vaccine cards shall not be considered as an additional mandatory requirement for educational, employment and other similar government transaction purposes."

Just a few days ago, however, the President has ordered the concerned authorities to arrest the unvaccinated people who violate the stay-at-home orders. This he said in the face of the rising cases of new infections throughout the country. In fact, as of

this writing, the country already has nearly 3 million cases of the virus, the second-highest number of infections in Southeast Asia.

Such an order violates the rights of the people according to dissenters, and it runs contrary to the earlier policy that vaccine cards shall not be made a requirement for various transactions. Why can't the government stick to its previous order so as not to violate the people's rights?

While this, indeed, could be a violation of some people's rights, it is also meant to uphold the welfare of the majority. Yes, it's a contradiction with former policies, but we need to remember that we are dealing here with a deadly, unpredictable virus that could mutate in a matter of hours and become several times more contagious. Any government will always be caught offhand with this fast-spreading, highly-mutating virus. At any rate, the majority's safety and survival must prevail.

For sure they know that our people are desperate for jobs this pandemic season, and so they try to make more money out of this desperation. How? By, yes, offering teaching jobs to our skilled teachers, yet the pay is so insulting. Generally, they just pay our teachers one to two dollars per hour.

Amid this meager pay, they are quick to impose sanctions and penalties that are subtly designed to deprive the teachers of their deserved salary, for said penalties would some-

Santiago said in a phone interview.

It took about 30 minutes before concerned citizens reported the incident to the local police station, according to Santiago.

Failure to pay the basic real property tax and the additional SEF tax on or before the dates indicated above shall subject the taxpayer to the payment of interest at the rate of two percent (2%) per month on the unpaid amount or fraction thereof, until the delinquent tax shall have been fully paid. Provided, however, that in no case shall the total interest on the unpaid tax or portion thereof exceed thirty-six (36) months or seventy two percent (72%).

Payment shall be made at the Office of the Municipal Treasurer where the property is located.

The Province may avail the remedies for the collection of real property tax by administrative action through levy on real property and sale of real property by public auction or by judicial action as provided in the Code.

teachers from the US, UK, Canada, and Australia far higher, like 20 or 30 dollars per hour. They will never pay this much if they have nothing more left from the students' payments. The fact that they can pay this much implies that their students pay really big amounts, and their earnings are huge.

With Filipino teachers,

these companies would hardly even pay two dollars per hour. Now how much do they earn given our salary-deprived teachers? It must be a huge amount. They are just using our poor, desperate teachers to enrich themselves. They appear to be champions of opportunities, but what they do is tantamount to exploitation.

Few days into my reassignment to La Paz Central School, I have encountered certain issues on teacher professional development, inadequate equipment needed in sustaining the printing of modules; orderliness and cleanliness of school grounds, ruined/uneven pathways, and non-functional outdoor handwashing facilities.

Unfazed with the foregoing challenges, I banked on the support of the PTA, LGU, alumni, and other relevant stakeholders. As a result, the cleanliness and orderliness issue that could be attributed to the presence of old and unnecessary structures were eventually addressed through the help of LGU-La Paz spearheaded by Hon. Mayor Angel Sia, Jr. Two fraternities, the TAU GAMMA PI and AKHRO helped in the clearing of debris/ rubble on separate schedules.

We were so fortunate that teacher professional development-related issue was addressed with the inclusion of La Paz Central School in the list of schools being pi-

lotted in the implementation of Project SERG (Sustaining Education Reform Gains) by DepEd in collaboration with the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade thru SAVE THE CHILDREN-PHILS.

This project seeks to strengthen the Teacher Professional Development (TPD) through the identification of learning needs and appropriate learning interventions while engaging the teachers in their own professional development and building a learning community within the school. SAVE THE CHILDREN PHILS. has also donated two units of handwashing facilities in favor of the school.

Generous donations have poured in. With this, issues on inadequate printers, ruined/uneven pathways and handwashing facility were addressed.

Eastern Visayas posts \$147.75 trade surplus in August 2021 (Preliminary Data)

Eastern Visayas registered a USD 200.10 million total trade-in August 2021. This was more than double the amount of total trade registered in August 2020 at USD 95.86 million.

The increase in external trade was largely due to export sales which grew by more than one-fold or 130.64 percent, from USD 75.41 million in August 2020 to USD 173.93 million in August 2021. Import value also increased

by 28.01 percent, from USD 20.45 million in August 2020 to USD 26.17 million in August 2021.

Balance of Trade in Goods (BoT-G) posted a trade surplus of USD 147.75 million in August 2021, almost three-folds higher than the USD 54.97 million BoT-G recorded in August 2020.

The total volume of the region's export in August 2021 was 151.98 million kilograms. The region's exports were composed

mainly of copper and articles thereof commodity group. This was valued at USD 164.46 million and shared 94.56 percent of the total value of exports in August 2021. Export sales from People's Republic of China registered at USD 115.50 million was two-thirds (66.41%) of the total export value of the region, making it the top export destination in August 2021.

The total volume of the region's import in August 2021 was 75.38

million kilograms. The bulk of the region's imports was the commodity group of mineral fuels, mineral oils and products of their distillation; bituminous substances; mineral waxes. This commodity group contributed USD 16.99 million or 64.90 percent of the total import value in August 2021. About 44.64 percent of the goods imported by the region came from Singapore, which billed USD 11.68 million in August 2021. **(PR)**

his appeal for still unvaccinated Taclobanons to get their shots not only to have a 'defense' against the deadly virus but also for them to enter establishments and even government offices.

"This is the new normal," he said, referring to the vaccination need.

He also welcomed non-residents but are working in the city to have themselves vaccinated in Tacloban.

As of Thursday, 172,157 city residents have received their first dose of which 150,863 of them are now considered as fully vaccinated or for having received their second shots.

Dr. Gloria Fabrigas, city health officer, said that while cases of COVID-19 in Tacloban is on the uptick, they have not monitored any severe or critical condition.

This could be attributed to the high vaccination rate in the city, she said, adding that almost all of the COVID-19 patients of the city are at their homes for isolation.

"And beginning on

Monday, our vaccination campaign will be extended up to seven pm as directed by the city mayor to ensure more people will avail of our vaccination campaign," Fabrigas said.

In Tabango town, Leyte, priests who are not based in the town but either to officiate or to attend mass relative to the town fiesta on Saturday are also required to present their vaccination cards before they will be allowed entry to the municipality proper.

In Catbalogan City, an executive order issued by Mayor Dexter Uy, directed, among others, that all employees, regardless of their status, are to be fully vaccinated. Otherwise, they have to undergo RT-PCR test or every two weeks at their own expense.

In Borongan City, Mayor Jose Ivan Dayan Agda has ordered that unvaccinated persons are to stay at their homes 'at all times' save for medical emergencies purposes.

In Northern Samar, the outpatient department of its provincial hospital was temporarily closed beginning on Thursday due

to the number of health workers getting the infection and the surge of patients admitted due to COVID-19.

On Friday, Eastern Visayas also logged its highest single-day cases since the pandemic started for more than two years now.

The Department of Health reported of 450 new cases, bringing the re-

gion's total active cases of COVID-19 to 1,771.

All six provinces of the region have registered new cases with Leyte, which includes Tacloban City, having the highest with 291 cases followed by Northern Samar with 68; Samar, 52; Eastern Samar, 32; Southern Leyte, 5; and Biliran, 2. **(with report ROEL T. AMAZONA**

As EV experiences surge of COVID-19 cases

RIATF throws support on LGUs ‘no vax card, no entry’ policy

TACLOBAN CITY – The Regional Inter-Agency Task Force (RIATF) in Eastern Visayas supports the ‘no vaccination, no entry policy now imposed by some local government units (LGUs) and business establishments in the region in the wake of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) surge.

The no vaccination card, no entry policy will encourage more individuals in the region to be vaccinated, the RIATF said.

The regional council has earlier approved a resolution formalizing its support on this policy, Arnaldo Escobar, RIATF co-chair and the regional director of the Department of Interior and Local Government.

“We passed a resolution that strongly encouraging our LGUs to adopt policies, resolution, ordinances that will ramp-up the demand of vaccines among our unvaccinated individuals and these policies might include the use of vaccination card or vax certificate na pwedeng gamitin

ng mga private establishments to disincentivize or incentivize those who are vaccinated na pwedeng pumasok sa kanilang establishments,” he said.

Based on the data of the Department of Health(DOH) in the region, at least 58.9% or 1,980,594 individuals in Eastern Visayas are already fully vaccinated while 2, 420, 624 had already received one dose.

Eastern Visayas is targeting to inoculate at least 3, 362,637 residents based on the 70% of the total population.

Both the RIATF and the DOH hopes that the new policy will result in the increase of the vaccination rate in the region.

After several weeks of having single-digit cases of COVID-19 from December until the first week of January, the region is again experiencing a surge of cases with 450 recorded on Thursday (January 14).

The total number of active cases in the region is 1,771.

DOH-8 regional epidemiology and surveillance unit (RESU) chief Marc Steven Capungcol in a press briefing said that they at the health agency are bothered with the surge of Covid-19 cases the region is experiencing since the past days.

Capungcol said that they have already resumed sending samples to the Philippine Genome Cen-

ter to determine the variant of the COVID virus that causes the increase of cases in the region.

The health official once again appeals to the public to follow all health protocols like observing physical distancing, proper wearing of face masks, hand washing or sanitizing, and avoid going to places with a large crowd.

“As responsible people, we should know how to practice our responsibility in doing the minimum public health standards. Our cases may be increasing and we can see this in the coming weeks but I hope everyone will be responsible enough. This is not just a fight of the DOH but this is the fight

of everybody, especially in our region. Let us all be safe. Let us all be vigilant

and let’s take care of ourselves,” Capungcol said. (ROEL T. AMAZONA)

Hubang Elementary School through the Alternative Learning System launches "Project BUBLIG"

In consonance to the Republic Act 11510 otherwise known as the Alternative Learning System Act, the Hubang Elementary School through the Alternative Learning System (ALS) launches "Project BUBLIG" on January 10, 2022.

"Project BUBLIG" (Building and Using Best Learning Intervention in reading for the basic literacy Group of learners) is a project designed to help the basic literacy learners of the Alternative Learning System - Hubang Elementary School develop the skill in reading.

This project employs the idea of an incentive-based strategy that aims to reward the learners for their attendance necessary in teaching the skill in reading. The launching was graced with the presence of the school head, teachers, mobile

teacher, barangay officials of barangay Hubang, Alangalang, Leyte, and the district supervisor of Alangalang II District.

This project is a collaboration of the school, BLGU of Hubang and the families/guardians of the respondents to this project. The benefits of learning the skill in reading cannot be attained without participation. Thus, using the incentives can help attract and retain the learners by promoting attendance and making them feel invested in the program (Collins et al, 2008).

It is actually a process that if these learners attend classes, they will be given proper intervention, eventually, it will gauge learners to enhance their skill in reading.

According to the proponent of this project, learners are entitled to receive goods amounting to P300 monthly

as a reward for their continued active participation in the ALS program.

The incentive which are provided, now functions as a motivation for them to invest their time in the ALS and do their part well in learning how to read or enhancing their reading ability through the help of the teacher. Research shows that, while they're in school, the enthusiasm to learn gets higher if a reward is expected after each accomplished task (Jackson, 2012). Thus, a greater chance to make these learners become readers in sooner time. Besides, when they become readers soon, they will eventually develop the other basic skills essential for them to become better individuals in the community.

PNP condemns shooting of an intel cop in Northern Samar

TACLOBAN CITY – The Philippine National Police (PNP) has condemned the fatal shooting of an intelligence police officer in Catubig, Northern Samar on January 10.

The Police Regional Office 8 (Eastern Visayas) here said the "treacherous" attack against Staff Sgt. Joerel Pajac was a clear violation of human rights.

"We call on witnesses to the incident to cooperate with our police to identify the attackers so that justice will be served," the PNP said in a statement issued on Tuesday night.

Pajac, 39, a resident of Calingnan village in Catubig town, was assigned to the Northern Samar Police Intelligence Unit.

He was about to disembark from a motorboat when four armed men suddenly appeared and shot him.

The unarmed victim

jumped into the water but the gunmen continued shooting at him before fleeing towards San Francisco village.

The victim's body was recovered floating on the river after more than an hour.
