

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

June 16, 1965



The June meeting of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held in the Illini Union, Urbana, Illinois, on Wednesday, June 16, 1965, beginning at 10:30 a.m.

President Howard W. Clement called the meeting to order and asked the Secretary to call the roll. The following members of the Board were present: Mr. Howard W. Clement, Mr. Earl M. APPOINTMENT OF HEAD TRACK COACH

(5) The Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and the Board of Directors of the Athletic Association of the University of Illinois recommend the appointment of Robert C. Wright, presently Head Track Coach at the Oak Park-River Forest High School, as Head Track Coach beginning July 1, 1965, at an annual salary of \$12,000.

This appointment is to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Leo T. Johnson after twenty-eight years of service as Coach of Track Teams. Mr. Johnson also served part-time as a member of the faculty in the Department of Physical Education for Men from 1937 until 1961 when he retired from his teaching position but continued as Head Track Coach for another four years. Mr. Wright will be on full-time appointment as Coach, and his salary will be paid by the Athletic Association.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Williamson, this appointment was approved.

APPOINTMENT OF TENNIS COACH

(6) The Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and the Board of Directors of the Athletic Association of the University of Illinois by its Executive Committee recommend the appointment of Dan Olson, presently Head Tennis Coach at Riverside-Brookfield High School, as Head Tennis Coach at the University beginning September 1, 1965, at an annual salary of \$3,000 to be paid by the Athletic Association.

Mr. Olson will also teach part-time in the Department of Physical Education for Men on a University appointment. As Coach he will succeed Mr. Howard J. Braun who has asked to be relieved of coaching tennis because of the work load of other coaching and Athletic Association duties.

I have approved this appointment and report it for record.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this appointment was confirmed.

CHAIRMANSHIP OF DEPARTMENT OF SPECIAL EDUCATION, URBANA-CHAMPAIGN

(7) The Dean of the College of Education recommends the appointment of Associate Professor Robert A. Henderson as Chairman of the Department of

Special Education for two years from September 1, 1965, at a salary which will be determined when the budget for 1965-66 is submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval.

Professor Henderson will succeed Professor Samuel A. Kirk, who, however, will remain in his administrative position as Director of the Institute for Research on Exceptional Children.

This recommendation is submitted after consultation with the Executive Committee of the Department and the Executive Committee of the College.

The Acting Dean of the Graduate College and the Executive Vice-President and Provost concur.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Williamson, this appointment was approved.

CHAIRMANSHIP OF DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION, URBANA-CHAMPAIGN

(8) The Dean of the College of Education recommends the appointment of Associate Professor John R. Palmer as Chairman of the Department of History and Philosophy of Education for two years from September 1, 1965, at a salary to be determined when the budget for 1965-66 is submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval.

Professor Palmer will succeed Dr. William O. Stanley, who has asked to be relieved of his administrative duties as Chairman of the Department so that he may return to full-time teaching and research.

This recommendation is submitted after consultation with the Executive Committee of the Department and the Executive Committee of the College.

The Acting Dean of the Graduate College and the Executive Vice-President and Provost concur.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this appointment was approved.

CHANGES IN THE CURRICULUM PREPARATORY TO THE TEACHING OF ENGLISH

(9) The University Committee on the Preparation of Secondary School Teachers of English, the Department of English, and the Urbana-Champaign Senate recommend the addition of a Teacher Education Minor in English as a Second Language to the Curriculum Preparatory to the Teaching of English, effective September 1, 1965.

The addition is justified by the present need for teachers trained in the teaching of English as a second language in the United States as well as in foreign countries. In Illinois, the center of the greatest need for teachers with this training is in Chicago. However, teachers in the smaller communities of Illinois may also be called upon to teach English to speakers of other languages. Interest in this program has been indicated by the requests which have been made for this special training as well as by the current increase in the enrollment of Linguistics/Rhetoric 388, Linguistics in Language Learning, in which the principles of teaching and learning English as a second language are presented.

A memorandum giving the complete details of this program is being filed with the Secretary of the Board for background record.

The Senate Coordinating Council has indicated that no other Senate jurisdiction is involved.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Pogue, this recommendation was approved.

DISCONTINUATION OF COMBINED LIBERAL ARTS-LAW DEGREE

(10) The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the Urbana-Champaign Senate recommend that the arrangement by which a student may transfer thirty-two hours of credit from an accredited law school other than the University of Illinois to complete the requirement for the University of Illinois baccalaureate degree be discontinued, effective September 1, 1965.

The arrangement indicated was established as a supplement to the policy of awarding such degrees to qualified University of Illinois undergraduates who

went on to the University of Illinois College of Law. Since, however, the major law schools of the country have, with one or two exceptions, begun to require the baccalaureate degree for admission, and since the University of Illinois College of Law has established such a degree requirement, there appears to be little reason to continue the arrangement.

The Senate Coordinating Council has indicated that no other Senate jurisdiction is involved.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this recommendation was approved.

CURRICULUM IN THE TEACHING OF DANCE

(11) The University Committee on the Preparation of Teachers of Physical Education for Women, the Department of Physical Education for Women, and the Urbana-Champaign Senate recommend changes in the Curriculum in the Teaching of Dance. The hours required for graduation are being raised from 130 to 132 to fit the pattern established in physical education curricula. The present curriculum and the revision vary in the number of physical education and dance courses that have been dropped or made elective. Courses are grouped into divisions with like purposes and labeled with descriptions most commonly found in the catalog on Undergraduate Study.

The curriculum provides a new identification for the dance emphasis in the teacher education option in the curriculum in Physical Education for Women. Accordingly, the name of the degree for this curriculum is changed from Bachelor of Science in Physical Education to Bachelor of Science in the Teaching of Dance as a more descriptive title of the program. The Degree of Bachelor of Science will be continued for other curricula in the College of Physical Education.

A new physical education minor to accompany this curriculum has also been approved. This minor will enable the Bachelor of Science major in dance to teach in a high school which employs a highly specialized and competent modern dance teacher but requires that she teach other courses than in dance.

A memorandum giving the complete details of this program is being filed with the Secretary of the Board for background record.

The Senate Coordinating Council has indicated that no other senate jurisdiction is involved.

I concur.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins, this recommendation was approved.

REPORT OF CHANGES CONCERNING RHETORIC 200 AND 201 (REMEDIAL WRITING)

(12) The following changes, effective September 1, 1965, concerning Rhetoric 200 and 201 (Remedial Writing) have been approved by the Urbana-Champaign Senate and are reported to the Board of Trustees as a matter of record:

1. Rhetoric 200 and 201 have been made optional instead of required courses for students who fail the Qualifying Examination in English.
2. Three hours credit for these courses has been restored, this credit not to be counted toward graduation but at the option of the student's college to be counted in the semester average. Credit for these courses was dropped on a trial basis in 1961.

The Senate Committee on Student English, which has sponsored the changes, indicates that making these courses optional will place more responsibility on the student for achieving competence in English while allowing him a choice of methods for reaching the required standard; namely, Rhetoric 200 or 201, the Writing Clinic, private study, or tutorial work. There is also a need to conserve the rhetoric teaching staff.

With regard to the restoration of credit, the Committee believes that this change will improve incentive and morale inasmuch as students tend to neglect noncredit courses.

The Senate Coordinating Council has indicated that no other Senate jurisdiction is involved.

On motion of Mr. Hughes, the action of the Senate was confirmed.

**HOSPITAL-MEDICAL-SURGICAL INSURANCE POLICIES
FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF**

(13) Bids have been received on the hospital-medical-surgical insurance program for staff and students for one year from September 1, 1965, with the right reserved to renew such insurance annually thereafter upon mutual agreement between the insurer and the University. A schedule of bids is submitted herewith and a copy is being filed with the Secretary.

Equally low bids were received from the Continental Assurance Company, the company which is now providing the coverage, and the Continental Casualty Company. The Vice-President and Comptroller recommends award of a contract for the same benefits as the current program to the present insurance carrier, the Continental Assurance Company, 31 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, at the following rates:

TERM LIFE INSURANCE FOR STAFF MEMBERS

(14) Bids have been received on Term Life Insurance for all active, permanent, and continuous employees of the University. The policy provides a renewable term insurance on a three-year rate basis with initial coverage limited to an option of \$5,000 or \$10,000 and provisions for the employee to increase the amount of insurance each year. The policy will be written for an indefinite term based upon the schedule of rates filed. No medical examination is required, and all qualified employees may enroll irrespective of health. The entire cost of the insurance will be paid by the employees electing this insurance.

The Vice-President and Comptroller recommends assignment of this coverage to the lowest bidder, the Northwestern National Life Insurance Company of Minneapolis, Minnesota, through the firm of Marsh & McLennan, 231 South La Salle Street, Chicago, Illinois.

A schedule of the monthly rates for each \$1,000 of insurance, for the various age levels, and a list of the bids received, based upon the total monthly premium if every employee elected to purchase \$10,000 insurance, are submitted herewith and copies are being filed with the Secretary of the Board for record.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this recommendation was approved.

Funds for these services are available in the Universities Building Fund and have been released by the Governor.

Warren & Van Praag, Inc., Consulting Engineers, Decatur

For engineering services for extensions, additions, and improvements to the University water distribution system, including water mains and the filtration plant, at Urbana-Champaign.

The fee for water main work is based on Schedule B of Minimum Fees established by the Illinois Society of Professional Engineers.

The fee for work at the water filtration plant is based on Schedule A of Minimum Fees established by the Illinois Society of Professional Engineers.

Funds for these services are available from the Universities Building Fund and have been released by the Governor.

The Committee on Buildings and Grounds and the Advisory Committee on the Selection of Architects and Engineers have been consulted and support these recommendations.

I concur.

EASEMENT TO ILLINOIS POWER COMPANY

(23) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend grant of an easement to the Illinois Power Company over a strip of land thirty feet wide on the University farm property at the southeast corner of the intersection of the "A.T.&T." Road and South First Street, for the installation of a sixteen-inch high-pressure gas main as part of the long-range expansion of the Illinois Power Company gas distribution system plan for Champaign-Urbana.

tion such instruments of conveyance, contract, or other document or documents as to them may seem necessary or desirable in order to grant to Illinois Power Company, an Illinois Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Grantee," its successors and assigns, the right and easement to construct, reconstruct, operate, maintain, repair, alter, replace, move and remove a 16-inch gas main and other equipment appurtenant thereto, under, through and across the land hereinafter described and the right of ingress to and egress therefrom; the rights and easement granted to be limited to the extent that this public Corporation has the present right and capacity to grant the same. Grantee shall agree to repair any damage caused to property of this Corporation by the construction, reconstruction, operation, maintenance, repairing, alteration, moving and removing of said gas main and to indemnify this Corporation and its representatives from liability in connection with Grantee's activities. The right-of-way easement shall remain in full force and effect from the date granted and for so long thereafter as said gas transportation line is continued in service and has not been abandoned and discontinued. Upon termination of the easement Grantee shall peaceably surrender possession of said premises to this Corporation and full and complete title then shall remain in this Corporation free and clear of said easement and without necessity of re-entry or demand. The right-of-way easement shall be over the following-described property:

Situated in the State of Illinois, the County of Champaign and being a part of the North 129.13 acres of the West $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 31, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian, and being more fully bounded and described as follows:

PARCEL A

A strip of land Thirty Feet in width, being five (5) Feet East and Twenty-five (25) Feet West of the following-described line:

Beginning at a point in the South line of the said North 129.13 acres, said point being 971.4 feet East of the West line of said Section 31, thence Northerly along the centerline of the existing 10-inch gas transportation line to a point in the North line of said Section 31, said point being 955.8 Feet East of the Northwest corner of said Section 31; said parcel containing 1.374 acres, more or less.

PARCEL B

A rectangular tract of land described as follows:

Beginning at a point 30 Feet South and 930.8 Feet East of the Northwest corner of the Northwest Quarter of Section 31, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence South 35 Feet; thence East 30 Feet; thence North 35 Feet; thence West 30 Feet to the point of beginning; said parcel containing 1650 Square Feet (0.038 acres), more or less.

EASEMENT TO ILLINOIS BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY

(24) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend a grant of easement to Illinois Bell Telephone Company over the north four feet and the west four feet of the north 35 feet of 305 North Prospect Avenue, Champaign, Illinois, for placing a buried telephone cable of sufficient size to handle present and future loads.

Company shall agree to repair any damage caused to property of this Corporation by the construction, reconstruction, operation, maintenance, renewal, or removal of said telephone communications cable, and to indemnify the University and its representatives from liability in connection with its activities; the term of said easement to be for such period as the easement may be used for the above described purposes, but upon the discontinuation of use of or abandonment of said telephone communications cable, said easement to thereupon cease and determine without necessity of re-entry or demand; the rights and easements granted to be limited to the extent that this public corporation has the present right and capacity to grant the same. The right-of-way easement shall be over the following described property:

Situated in the State of Illinois, the County of Champaign and the City of Champaign, and being a part of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 18, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian, and being more fully bounded and described as follows:

The North Four (4) Feet and the West Four (4) Feet of the North Thirty-five (35) Feet of Lot Three (3) of Lenington's First Addition to the City of Champaign.

ADDITION TO CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CHICAGO CIRCLE CAMPUS

(25) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend an increase of \$19,981.16 in the contract with Gust K. Newberg Construction Co., Chicago, for construction of the Chicago Circle Campus, to add handrails in the twelve lecture rooms and at certain stairs on the elevated walkway system in order to provide additional safety and protection for students, staff, and others.

Funds are available in the construction budget.

ADDITION TO CONTRACT FOR SITE DEVELOPMENT WORK AT THE MENTAL HEALTH CENTER COMPLEX

(26) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend an increase of \$23,984 in the contract with General Paving Company Incorporated, Champaign, for site development work for the Mental Health Research Center to provide a heavier load bearing paving on the main access road serving the Center and the Firemanship Training facility.

As the road specified in the contract adequately meets the needs of the Department of Mental Health, it is recommended that the University assume the increased cost.

Funds are available in the Universities Building Fund and have been released by the Governor.

ADDITION TO CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SINGLE GRADUATE RESIDENCE HALLS

(27) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend an increase of \$11,636.24 in the contract with McCarthy Bros. Construction Company, St. Louis, Missouri, for construction of the Single Graduate Residence Halls (SG-3) to provide for the installation of underground concrete encased conduit for electric service to the site in lieu of overhead lines.

Funds are available in the construction budget.

**INVITATION TO PRESIDENT TO PARTICIPATE IN FOURTH
GENERAL CONFERENCE OF THE INTERNATIONAL
ASSOCIATION OF UNIVERSITIES**

(28) I request the Board of Trustees to authorize my attendance at the Fourth General Conference of the International Association of Universities in Tokyo, Japan. The official visitation is scheduled for the period from August 31 until September 6, exclusive of travel time.

The plenary meetings of the only world organization of universities are held quinquennially. Since its establishment, the International Association has grown steadily in membership and in the significance of its activities. Today, its membership is a roster of the leading institutions in higher education throughout the world. The Association is actually, and even more potentially, a force of unquestionable significance to international cultural development and understanding.

The mission will involve no travel expense to the University of Illinois.

On motion of Mr. Pogue, the President's request was approved.

REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM THE PRESIDENT
OF THE BOARD

FUTURE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

July

President Clement announced the next meeting of the Board will be held as scheduled, July 21, 1965, Urbana, Illinois. A major item of business at this meeting will be the operating budget for 1965-66. The Finance Committee will meet on July 20 to study the budget in consultation with the University officials.

Executive Committee Meeting

On call of the Chairman, the Executive Committee will meet late in June to act on recommendations for purchases which must be authorized prior to the end of the fiscal year.

August

President Clement asked the wishes of the Board concerning a meeting in August.

On motion of Mr. Williamson, the Board voted to omit a meeting in August and that the Executive Committee should act for the Board if necessary.

COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

The Trustees have received information and instructions concerning the Commencement Exercises at Urbana-Champaign on Saturday, June 19, 1965. Seven of the Trustees have indicated they will attend.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

COMMITTEE ON BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

At the meeting of the Board of Trustees on May 19, 1965, the President of the Board presented a petition which he and the other Trustees received, signed by a number of property owners and residents on Florida Avenue and on streets in the area of the intersection of Florida and Lincoln Avenues, asking that the original plan for the improvement of Florida Avenue be followed instead of the new design now required by the State Division of Highways which would involve additional rights-of-way at the intersection and would adversely affect property owners in the block immediately east of Lincoln Avenue and south of Florida Avenue.

This petition was referred to the Committee on Buildings and Grounds for consideration and advice.

At the same meeting, action on a proposal which had also been submitted to the Board for grants of the rights-of-way required for the projected improvement was deferred.

Mr. Pogue, for the Committee on Buildings and Grounds, reported that a meeting of the Committee was held earlier today to consider its assignment, and that the Committee heard three representatives of the Florida Avenue residents

and property owners who were objecting to the improvement as now proposed, and a representative of the Urbana Association of Commerce who spoke in favor of the improvement.

Following this hearing, the Committee received reports on the projected improvement from Director C. S. Havens of the Physical Plant and Professor John E. Baerwald of the Department of Civil Engineering, Director of the University's Highway Traffic Safety Center and Consultant to the State Division of Highways.

Following extended discussion of these presentations, the Committee found that the proposed improvement is part of long-range planning in which the University participated with the local communities, that recent up-graded highway standards require the alterations which will result in the further widening at the Florida and Lincoln Avenues intersection, that the Board of Trustees could not provide the remedy sought by the objectors, and that the University had in the course of planning committed itself to cooperating in the improvement.

All members of the Committee and other Trustees present at the meeting expressed sympathy with the property owners but agreed that no other course was open than to participate in the proposed improvement, and the Committee by unanimous vote so recommended.

Accordingly, Mr. Pogue reported the Committee supports the following recommendation and resolutions presented by the President of the University.

Florida Avenue Improvement

The Board of Trustees on April 17, 1958, approved a grant of right-of-way easement over University-owned land to the state of Illinois for the extension of Florida Avenue between Lincoln Avenue and Neil Street based upon then approved standards of highway design. The improvement has been completed between Neil and Fourth Streets.

On July 22, 1964, the Board approved the University's participation in the extension and improvement of Florida Avenue between Fourth Street in Champaign and Lincoln Avenue in Urbana. The Board of Supervisors of Champaign County and the City Councils of Champaign and Urbana have taken official action approving the paving of Florida Avenue. The design of Florida Avenue from Fourth Street to Lincoln Avenue, including the intersection, has just been completed and now meets the requirements of the Illinois Division of Highways.

To facilitate and provide for proper traffic movements through the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and Florida Avenue and to make a transition between the existing pavement east of Lincoln Avenue (34 feet wide) and the new pavement west of Lincoln Avenue (57 feet 2 inches wide including the median strip), and to provide for proper traffic movements through the intersection of Florida Avenue and Fourth Street, the engineers have indicated that additional right-of-way will be required over University-owned property.

These changes will increase the estimated construction costs by approximately \$170,000, which will be financed by the two cities and the county and will increase the University's contribution to the project, based on additional right-of-way, the relocation of trees, and additional engineering costs. The estimate of increased costs to the University is approximately \$26,100.

No payment will be made to the University for this easement, and the University will not be responsible for any further capital or construction costs or for any maintenance, cleaning, or repairs of the roadway and the drainage system. The University will retain the right to extend sidewalks, streets, and drives across the easement in the future, the cost of such extensions to be at the expense of the University.

Since part of the right-of-way easement is included in the site of the Pennsylvania Avenue Residence, it is also necessary to abandon a portion of the site in accordance with the provisions of the Resolution authorizing the issuance of bonds.

The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend approval of the increased contribution of the University to the project and that the necessary right-of-way easement over land owned by the University be conveyed to the state of Illinois.

I concur and recommend adoption of the following resolutions.

Resolution

WHEREAS, the authorities of the City of Champaign and Urbana, Illinois of Champaign County, Illinois, and the Board of Supervisors of Champaign County, Illinois and the State of Illinois have reached an agreement to construct and maintain a public roadway extending from a point west of Fourth Street in the City of Champaign, Illinois, to a point east of Lincoln Avenue in the City of Urbana, Illinois, which will constitute an extension of Florida Avenue in said cities, and the following described land, title to which is now held by the University of Illinois, will be needed by them for said purpose; and

WHEREAS, the construction and maintenance of said proposed public roadway will benefit the University of Illinois in various ways, and it is in the best interests of the University of Illinois, and will be advantageous to it, therefore, to grant an easement of right of way to the State of Illinois, acting by and through the Director of its Department of Public Works and Buildings over and across the following described land so that said proposed public roadway, constituting an extension of Florida Avenue in the Cities of Urbana and Champaign, Illinois, can be constructed and maintained thereon:

Therefore, It Is Hereby Resolved by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, that the Comptroller and Secretary of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, a public corporation of the State of Illinois, be, and they are hereby authorized to execute, acknowledge, and deliver in the name and in behalf of said public corporation, an instrument of conveyance in the form of a grant of right of way easement, and other documents in connection therewith, as they and the Legal Counsel of the University of Illinois may find necessary or desirable, in order to effect a conveyance from said public corporation to the State of Illinois, acting by and through the Director of its Department of Public Works and Buildings, of a right of way easement for the purpose of improving and extending Florida Avenue from a point approximately 85 feet west of Fourth Street in the City of Champaign, Illinois, to a point approximately 390 feet east of Lincoln Avenue in the City of Urbana, Illinois, over, upon and across the following described lands, viz:

TRACT B-1

Situated in the State of Illinois, County of Champaign, the City of Champaign and being a part of the Southwest One Quarter of Section 18, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian, and being more fully bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point 21.49 feet North and 33.0 feet West of the Southeast corner of the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 18, said corner being marked with a brass rod; thence Northerly along the existing West R.O.W. line of Fourth Street a distance of 350.0 feet; thence Southwesterly a distance of 120.60 feet to a point 12.0 feet West of the said existing West R.O.W. line and 230.0 feet North of the point of beginning; thence Southerly parallel to and 12.0 feet West of the said existing West R.O.W. line a distance of 150.0 feet; thence Southwesterly a distance of 45.28 feet to a point 17.0 feet West of the said existing West R.O.W. line and 34.89 feet North of the existing North R.O.W. line of Florida Avenue; thence Southwesterly to a point 10.0 feet North of the said existing North R.O.W. line and 39.68 feet West of the said existing West R.O.W. line of Fourth Street; thence Southwesterly a distance of 46.10 feet to a point on the said North R.O.W. line, said point being 84.74 feet West of the point of beginning; thence Easterly along the said existing North R.O.W. line a distance of 84.74 feet to the point of beginning; said parcel containing 4,274.8 square feet (0.0981 acres) more or less.

TRACT B-2

Situated in the State of Illinois, the County of Champaign, the City of Champaign and being part of the Northwest One Quarter of Section 19, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian, and being more fully bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point 58.51 feet south of the Northwest corner of the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 19, said corner being marked with a brass rod; thence Southerly a distance of 20.0 feet; thence Westerly 33.0 feet parallel to and 20.0 feet South of the existing South R.O.W. line of Florida Avenue; thence Northwesterly to a point on the

WHEREAS the authorities of the City of Champaign, Illinois, the City of Urbana, Illinois, The Board of Supervisors of Champaign County, Illinois, and the State of Illinois propose to make certain improvements to Lincoln Avenue between Pennsylvania Avenue and Florida Avenue, in the City of Urbana, Illinois; and

WHEREAS the City of Urbana proposes to vacate (and thereby title thereto will vest in the University of Illinois) that portion of Virginia Drive lying between College Court and Florida Avenue (herein called the "Replacement Property") in exchange for the University conveying a grant of right of way easement to the State of Illinois over, upon and across the following described lands:

Situated in the State of Illinois, the County of Champaign and the City of Urbana, and being a part of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 18, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian, and being more fully bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a corner on the West property line of Lincoln Avenue in the City of Urbana, said corner being marked with an iron pipe and being 438.4 feet distant North of and 30.0 feet distant West of the Southeast corner of said Section 18; thence Northerly, along the West property line of said Lincoln Avenue, a distance of 406.2 feet to a corner, said corner being marked with an iron pipe and being also the intersection of the West property line of said Lincoln Avenue and the South property line of Pennsylvania Avenue in the City of Urbana; thence Westerly, along the South property line of said Pennsylvania Avenue, a distance of 26.0 feet to a corner, said corner being marked with an iron pipe; thence Southerly along a line parallel to the West property line of said Lincoln Avenue, a distance of 406.2 feet to a corner, said corner being marked with an iron pipe; thence Easterly a distance of 26.0 feet to the place of beginning, said parcel containing 0.242 acres, more or less,

(herein called the "Abandoned Property"), a portion of which was designated for, and constitutes a portion of, the Project Site of Project E (otherwise known as the Pennsylvania Avenue Residence) for the account of which \$5,000,000 Housing Revenue Bonds of 1960, Series B, and \$750,000 Housing Revenue Bonds of

1960, Series C, were issued under and pursuant to that Housing Revenue Bond Resolution of this Board of Trustees adopted December 17, 1958, as supplemented (herein called the "Resolution"); and

WHEREAS neither the Abandoned Property proposed to be conveyed nor the Replacement Property proposed to be acquired by the University in exchange therefor is revenue producing, and such exchange will be for the benefit of the University of Illinois, its students and faculty as well as the holders of the bonds outstanding under the Resolution; and

WHEREAS the conveyance of the Abandoned Property will not materially affect the use or occupancy of any of the facilities for the account of which bonds have been issued under the Resolution or the revenues derived or to be derived from any such facilities.

Now, Therefore, Be It, and It Hereby Is Resolved that The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, a public corporation of the State of Illinois, does hereby permanently abandon the use of the said above described Abandoned Property as part of the Project Site and concurrently therewith replaces said Abandoned Property with the Replacement Property as part of the Project Site upon the acquiring of title to the Replacement Property by this public corporation.

Be It Further Resolved that inasmuch as neither the Abandoned Property nor the Replacement Property are revenue producing, all of the conditions precedent set forth in Section 8.01 of the Resolution are fully satisfied to the extent they may in any way be considered applicable.

On motion of Mr. Pogue, this resolution was adopted by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Jones, Mr. Page, Mr. Pogue, Mr. Swain, Mrs. Watkins, Mr. Williamson; no, none; absent, Mr. Dilliard, Mr. Johnston, Governor Kerner.

COMMITTEE ON GENERAL POLICY

Amendments of University of Illinois Statutes Relating to Academic Freedom and Tenure

The Committee on General Policy begins its report with an account of the official proceedings in the subject matter since the last formal action taken by the Board of Trustees on April 15, 1964, when it adopted a report with recommendations from this Committee on the revisions of the University of Illinois Statutes dealing with academic freedom and tenure and, concurrently, a resolution that the advice of the Senates be sought on these revisions as provided in Section 65 of the Statutes.

While seeking advice on revisions in Sections 6, 38, and 39 only, the Committee recommended tentative approval of other proposals submitted by the Senate Coordinating Council and transmitted to the Board on June 19, 1963. A document was sent to the University Senates under date of May 8, 1964, in which the President reviewed the status of consideration of proposed revisions of the Statutes prior to that date which included the revisions of Sections 6, 38, and 39, as recommended by the Committee on General Policy. A copy of this document is filed with the Secretary for record.

The proposed amendments submitted to the Senates for advice had been evolved in discussions between the Board Committee on General Policy and the three University Senate Committees on Academic Freedom and had been approved by them. The document of May 8, 1964, also listed in parallel columns for ready comparison the present statutory provisions, the recommendations of the Senates and the Coordinating Council, and the modifications proposed by the Board of Trustees.

On May 19, 1964, the Chicago Undergraduate Division Senate expressed its approval of the modifications proposed by the Board.

On May 25, 1964, the Urbana-Champaign Senate defeated a motion to adopt the Board's modifications and passed motions which (a) requested an opportunity for further consultation with the Board of Trustees (or a committee thereof) for the purpose of arriving at a consensus which would reflect the principles of the

amendments adopted by the three Senates; (b) designated a Committee of the Senate for such purpose; and (c) suggested that the Board invite the corresponding Committees on Academic Freedom from the other two Senates to join in such consultations.

On June 3, 1964, the Medical Center Senate also defeated a motion to approve the Board's proposed modifications and passed motions requesting further consultations in essentially the manner suggested by the previous action of the Urbana-Champaign Senate.

In accordance with the request of the Urbana-Champaign and the Medical Center Senates, on June 17, 1964, the President of the University recommended to the Board of Trustees that:

further consultation be arranged with the designated committees, including the Committee on Academic Freedom of the Chicago Undergraduate Division;

the Liaison Committee of the Senate Coordinating Council also be requested to participate in the consultation as provided for in Section 7(d) of the University Statutes; and that

the matter be referred to the Committee on General Policy of the Board of Trustees for further action.

This recommendation was approved by the Board of Trustees.

On the same day, June 17, 1964, the Board's Committee on General Policy voted to transmit through the President of the University to the three Senate Committees on Academic Freedom and to the Liaison Committee of the Senate Coordinating Council a statement in which the Committee observed that, as a result of its earlier consultations with Senate representatives, it believed the modifications proposed by the Board in Sections 38(d) and 38(e)(7) "conformed with the general principles of the Senate revisions of the Statutes and were by way of clarification, rather than modification, of those principles." Additionally, the statement noted that the language proposed by the Board for Sections 38(e)(8) and 39(b), as interpreted in the Board Committee's May 1, 1964, Supplementary Report, also appeared to be acceptable to the Senate conferees, particularly since the respective Senate Committees on Academic Freedom had moved approval of the Board's proposals at the various Senate meetings.

To obtain clarification of the reasons behind the rejection of the Board proposals by the two Senates, the June 17 Committee statement set forth certain questions which appeared to be of central concern and suggested that further consultations with representatives of the three Senates be deferred until after the Committee on General Policy had received "written statements from the respective Senate Committees on Academic Freedom." The concluding paragraph of the June 17, 1964, action by the Board's Committee on General Policy reads:

"The statements of the two Senate Committees, and any statements which the Chicago Undergraduate Division Senate and Senate Coordinating Council Liaison Committees (or individual members of any one of these Committees) might wish to submit, should be sent to the Secretary of the Board of Trustees, Mr. A. J. Janata, who will transmit them to the members of this Committee, to the President, to the Liaison Committee of the Senate Coordinating Council, and to the individual members of the three Senate Committees on Academic Freedom. Mr. Janata will then take steps to arrange with all of these groups mutually convenient times for the consultations requested by the Urbana-Champaign and Medical Center Senates."

On January 4, 1965, the Secretary of the Board of Trustees received a Joint Report from the Committees on Academic Freedom of the three Senates and copies were sent to the Trustees and President. (This report was prepared in December, 1964, and the Senate Committees' versions of the statutory texts are so dated.) The Liaison Committee of the Coordinating Council submitted a statement on February 5, 1965. The recommendations submitted by these groups have been under study by the Board's Committee on General Policy, as directed by the Board of Trustees.

The Committee on General Policy is now prepared to recommend to the Board of Trustees acceptance of the specific proposals for changes in the Statutes of the University, as contained in the Joint Report and as reproduced as

an appendix (Sheets I, II, III, IV) to this report of your Committee. Such acceptance would not extend to the other material in the Joint Report.

Before submitting its report to the Board, the Committee on General Policy instructed the President to inquire from the Senate Committees and the Liaison Committee as to their desires for consultation, in view of the proposed action of the Board's Committee. He was also instructed to inform the consultative groups that the Committee's action would have to do with the specific proposals for Statute revision, not with the discourse in the Joint Report. The Committee on General Policy further requested that at the earliest time possible the advice of the Senates be sought on the statutory revisions proposed in the Joint Report, for the consideration of the Board of Trustees.

The Chairmen of the Senate Committees and the Secretary of the Coordinating Council have stated that in view of the proposed recommendation of the Board's Committee on General Policy, as herein described, no further consultation between the Board's Committee and the Senates and Council Committees appears necessary prior to consideration by the Senates of the proposed statutory revisions.

Therefore, in accordance with Section 65 of the University Statutes, on behalf of the Committee on General Policy acting for the Board of Trustees, the President formally asked the Senates to give their advice on the proposed changes in the Statutes as indicated in appended Sheets I, II, III, and IV (pages 595 to 598) under the heading "Senate Committee Version, December 1964." The text under these headings is precisely the text in the Joint Report of the three Senate Committees and is concurred in by the Liaison Committee of the Senate Coordinating Council. Advice was also sought on the proposal on Sheet IV, in the column labeled "Board Committee Version, May 1965" which provides a fixed period of delay in the effective date of a dismissal. No phrasing was submitted on this latter subject by the Senate Committees. Your Committee concurs in principle with the general point made in the Joint Report and proposes the statutory statement presented on Sheet IV for its implementation.

Recommendation: The three Senates have now expressed their approval of the revisions as presented in the last columns of the appended texts. Your Committee recommends adoption of these revisions along with final adoption of the collateral revisions recommended to and tentatively approved by the Board on April 15, 1964, on which there was no dissent from the Senates.

**Amendments of University of Illinois Statutes
Relating to Academic Freedom and Tenure**

Sheet No. 1

Current, 1958 Statutes

38(d) Causes for discharge shall consist of conduct seriously prejudicial to the University through deliberate infraction of law or commonly accepted standards of morality, neglect of duty, inefficiency, or incompetency. The enumeration of causes for discharge shall not be deemed exclusive, and the Board of Trustees reserves the power to discharge for other causes, but it is to be distinctly understood that this power will be exercised only under exceptional circumstances and then only for conduct which is clearly prejudicial to the best interests of the University.

38(d) Due cause for dismissal shall be deemed to exist only if, with all due regard for the freedoms and protections provided for in Sec. 39 of these Statutes, a faculty member's conduct is found to demonstrate clearly and convincingly either that: (1) he has been grossly neglectful of, or grossly inefficient in,

the performance of his University duties; or that: (2) he can no longer be relied upon to perform his University duties and functions in a manner consonant with professional standards of competence and responsibility.

Board of Trustees Version, April, 1964

38(d) Due cause for dismissal shall be deemed to exist only if a faculty member's conduct is found to demonstrate clearly and convincingly either that (1) he has been grossly neglectful of, or grossly inefficient in, the performance of his University duties, or that (2) he can not be relied upon to perform his University duties and functions, or otherwise to conduct himself, in a manner consonant with professional standards of conduct, competence, and responsibility.

Senate Committee Version, December, 1964

38(d) Due cause for dismissal shall be deemed to exist only if (1) a faculty member has been grossly neglectful of or grossly inefficient in the performance of his University duties and functions; or (2) with all due regard for the freedoms and protections provided for in Section 39 of these Statutes, a faculty member's performance of his University duties and functions or his extramural conduct is found to demonstrate clearly and convincingly that he can no longer be relied upon to perform his University duties and functions in a manner consonant with professional standards of competence and responsibility; or (3) a faculty member has, during his employment by the University, illegally advocated overthrow of our constitutional form of government by force or violence.

38(e)(8) Suspension. An appointee may be suspended only under exceptional circumstances and with pay subject to the following provisions: a) The President may suspend before the filing of any charges only after giving notice to the chairman or, in the absence of the chairman from the University, to some member of the Faculty Advisory Committee that he believes that cause for dismissal may exist; b) If the President suspends after so giving notice to the chairman or some member of the Faculty Advisory Committee, or during consultation with the Faculty Advisory Committee, such suspension shall terminate within twenty days after that Committee has made its recommendations to the President unless the President initiates dismissal proceedings by the filing of charges for dismissal within that twenty-day period; and, c) If the President initiates dismissal proceedings by filing charges for dismissal, he may suspend the appointee, or may extend a previous suspension of the appointee, until the termination of those proceedings, or until the effective date of dismissal if the proceedings result in dismissal.

Board of Trustees Version, April, 1964

38(e)(8) Suspension. An appointee may be suspended by the President only when he considers such suspension clearly necessary and justified, subject to the following provisions: a) the President may suspend before the filing of any charges only after giving notice to the chairman or, in the absence of the chairman from the University, to some member of the Faculty Advisory Committee that he believes that cause for dismissal may exist; b) if the President suspends after so giving notice to the chairman or some member of the Faculty Advisory Committee, or during consultation with the Faculty Advisory Committee, such suspension shall terminate within thirty days after that Committee has made its recommendations to the President unless the President initiates dismissal proceedings by the filing of charges for dismissal within that thirty-day period; c) if the President initiates dismissal proceedings by filing charges for dismissal, he may suspend the appointee, or may extend a previous suspension of the appointee, until the termination of those proceedings, or until the effective date of dismissal if the proceedings result in dismissal; and d) if dismissal proceedings are not filed against a faculty member who has been suspended or, if filed, do not result

in a dismissal, the faculty member shall be entitled to receive the full amount of his agreed compensation as though no suspension had occurred.

Senate Committee Version, December, 1964

38(e)(8) Under exceptional circumstances, and when such action is clearly necessary and justified, the President may direct that a faculty member be relieved of some or all of his University duties and functions and reassigned to others, without prejudice and without loss of compensation, pending the final decision of his case, subject to the following provisions: a) the President may reassign duties before the filing of any charges only after giving notice to the chairman or, in the absence of the chairman from the University, to some member of the Faculty Advisory Committee, that he believes that cause for dismissal may exist; b) if the President reassigns duties after so giving notice to the chairman or some member of the Faculty Advisory Committee, such reassignment shall terminate within thirty days after that Committee has made its recommendations to the President unless the President initiates dismissal proceedings by the filing of charges for dismissal within that thirty-day period; and c) if the President initiates dismissal proceedings by filing charges for dismissal, he may reassign duties, or extend a previous reassignment of duties until the termination of those proceedings, or until the effective date of dismissal if the proceedings should result in dismissal.

Sheet No. III

Current 1958 Statutes, and Coordinated Council Version, June, 1963

39(b) In his role as citizen, the faculty member has the same freedoms as other citizens, without institutional censorship or discipline, although he should be mindful that accuracy, forthrightness, and dignity befit his association with the University and his position as a man of learning.

39(c) These freedoms do not include the right to advocate the overthrow of our constitutional form of government by force or violence.

Board of Trustees Version, April, 1964

39(b) In his role as a citizen, the faculty member at the University has the same freedoms as other citizens, but his special position as a member of a learned profession associated with an educational institution carries with it a special obligation to recognize that the public may judge his profession and the University by his conduct or his utterances. When he speaks or writes, a faculty member should be mindful of the admonitions that accuracy, forthrightness, and dignity befit his association with the University and his position as a man of learning. If a faculty member fails to heed these admonitions on an occasion when he is exercising his freedom of speech as a citizen, such failure shall not, of itself, constitute due cause for dismissal but, after consultation with the Faculty Advisory Committee, the President may take official cognizance of such failure.

39(c) These freedoms do not include the right to advocate the overthrow of our constitutional form of government by force or violence.

39(b) In his role as a citizen, the faculty member may exercise the same freedoms as other citizens, without institutional censorship or discipline. He should be mindful, however, that accuracy, forthrightness and dignity befit his association with the University and his position as a man of learning, and that the public may judge his profession and the University by his conduct and utterances.

39(c) If, in the President's judgment, a faculty member should fail to heed the admonitions of Section 39(b) on an occasion when he is exercising his freedom of expression as a citizen, the President may publicly disassociate the Board of Trustees and the University administration from, and express their disapproval of such objectionable expressions.

If the Board concludes that the appointee should be dismissed or asked to resign, in designating the effective date of dismissal or requested resignation, the Board will give due consideration to all relevant factors including, without limitation, the gravity of the appointee's conduct in question, the services to be rendered to the University by the appointee during any intervening period, and to the time reasonably required for the adjustment of the appointee's personal affairs. ***

38(e)(7) ***The Board will give due consideration to the findings, conclusions and recommendations of the Committee on Academic Freedom and Tenure, and the remainder of the record relevant to the charges before said Committee, and in all cases where a report was made by the Committee will invite a member of the Committee designated by its chairman to attend the hearing before the Board and afford him an opportunity to make a statement.

Board Committee Version, May, 1965

If the Board concludes that the appointee should be dismissed or asked to resign, the effective date of such dismissal or resignation shall not be less than one year from the date of the Board's decision unless the Board, in its discretion, determines that an earlier effective date is justified by the gravity of the appointee's conduct in question. ***

(The Senate Committees suggested no phrasing on this provision. The Board Committee concurs in principle with the general point on this subject made in the Joint Report and purposes the above statutory statement.)

This report was presented for the Committee on General Policy by Mr. Williamson, serving as Acting Chairman of the Committee in the absence of Mr. Johnston.

On motion of Mr. Williamson, the recommendation of the Committee was approved, and the revisions of the Statutes as indicated in the report were adopted.

PETITION FOR ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE OF MEDICINE

The petitioners ask for a review of the application and a hearing by the Board.

With the approval of the Board, this petition was referred to the Committee on the Chicago Departments for the purpose of granting the petitioners a hearing to determine whether the administrative action taken on the application for admission should be reconsidered, and to advise the Board on the matter. The Secretary was instructed to arrange for the hearing.

RECESS AND EXECUTIVE SESSION

President Clement announced that an executive session has been requested and is being ordered for property acquisitions and that this session would be held after the luncheon recess.

On motion of Mr. Swain, the Board recessed.

During the recess, and following the luncheon, the Trustees and other University officers visited the University Press building to inspect the new facilities.

When the Board reconvened, the same members of the Board, officers of the Board, and officers of the University as recorded at the beginning of these minutes were present, except Mr. Ray Page who asked to be excused.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee submitted the following report:

MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

On call of the Chairman, a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held in Room 1600, First National Bank Building, 38 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois, on Tuesday, April 6, 1965, beginning at 11:30 a.m. The following members of the Executive Committee were present: Mr. Wayne A. Johnston and Mrs. Frances B. Watkins. Also present were Mr. H. O. Farber, Vice-President and Comptroller, and Mr. James J. Costello, Legal Counsel.

Mr. Johnston acted as Chairman and stated that an executive session had been requested and was being ordered for consideration of recommendations relating to property acquisitions.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins, the Committee recessed and immediately reconvened in executive session with the same members and other University personnel present as are recorded at the beginning of these minutes.

Mr. Johnston stated that by action of the Board of Trustees on March 12, 1965, the Board of Trustees, pursuant to Article 4, Section 3 of the By-Laws, authorized the Executive Committee to act on any matters relating to the settlement of pending condemnation proceedings. The Committee then considered the following recommendation presented on behalf of the President of the University.

Settlement of Condemnation Suit

Pre-trial depositions have been taken in Case No. 64 L 684 (The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois v. Raymond Timpone et al.) for the condemnation of the property located at 1118-1120 West Oregon Street and 608 South Goodwin Avenue, Urbana, Illinois, as a part of the site for the Krannert Center for Performing Arts. The depositions have developed facts relating to the value of the property not heretofore available to the University, including information concerning a contract of sale of the property in April of 1964, as set forth in a memorandum from the Legal Counsel presented herewith for filing with the records of the Secretary of the Board of Trustees.

The Vice-President and Comptroller, the Director of the Physical Plant, and the Legal Counsel recommend that authorization be given to settle the litigation and acquire the property at a price not to exceed \$115,000.

The President of the University concurs.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins this recommendation was approved by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Johnston, Mrs. Watkins; no, none; absent, Mr. Clement.

The business of the meeting having been concluded, on motion of Mrs. Watkins the Committee adjourned.

PURCHASE OF PROPERTY AT 901 AND 903 WEST CALIFORNIA AVENUE, URBANA, ILLINOIS

(33) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that the Board of Trustees request the University of Illinois Foundation to purchase the properties at 901 and 903 West California Avenue, Urbana, Illinois, at a price of \$47,000, and lease them to the University of Illinois at a rental rate adequate to pay the interest on a bank loan to the Foundation to finance the purchase until the University has funds for their acquisition. **PURCHASE OF PROPERTY AT 506 SOUTH GREGORY PLACE,
URBANA, ILLINOIS**

(34) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that the Board of Trustees request the University of Illinois Foundation to purchase the property at 506 South Gregory Place, Urbana, Illinois, at a price of \$72,000, and lease the property to the University of Illinois at a rental rate adequate to pay the interest on a bank loan to the Foundation to finance the purchase until the University has funds for its acquisition. This property is required for future campus expansion east of the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts.

The property consists of an irregularly shaped lot fronting on South Gregory Place between Illinois Street and California Avenue and is improved with a two and three-fourth story six-unit apartment building.

**ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY AT 1111 WEST OREGON
STREET, URBANA, ILLINOIS**

(35) The University has been negotiating with the owner of the property at 1111 West Oregon Street, Urbana, Illinois, which is adjacent to the site for the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts and is required as part of the site for an academic building. The property consists of a lot 65 feet by 157 feet (10,205 square feet) and is improved with a three-story and basement frame building used as apartments. The owners have been advised that a recommendation would be submitted to the Board of Trustees for the purchase of their property at a price of \$42,000, based on University appraisals, but the owners price to sell is substantially higher than University appraisals. Accordingly, the Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that authorization be given for the acquisition of the property at 1111 West Oregon Street, Urbana, Illinois, by eminent domain and condemnation proceedings, and further request authorization for the settlement of the condemnation suit, if such settlement can be effected, at a price that is within appraisals received by the University.

Lot Twenty-two (22) in University Addition to the City of Urbana, situated in the City of Urbana, in the County of Champaign, and State of Illinois; commonly known as 1111 West Oregon Street, Urbana, Illinois,

is needed by the University of Illinois, an educational institution established and supported by the State of Illinois for use as a site for an academic building of the University of Illinois and for other educational purposes conducted and to be conducted by said University of Illinois and for the further expansion of the educational facilities of said University of Illinois and to enable said University of Illinois to discharge its duty to the people of said State and for public use, that funds are available to the University for the purchase of said land for said

educational purposes; that this Board of Trustees has negotiated with the owners of said land through their duly authorized representatives for the purchase of said land at a price which this Board of Trustees considers fair and reasonable and which it finds constitutes the present market value of said land, but that said owner has refused to sell and convey said land, or any portion thereof, to said The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois for such price and continues to refuse to sell and convey the same to it except for a consideration and price which this Board of Trustees deems unreasonable and excessive and is, therefore, unwilling and has refused to pay; and

Be It, and It Is Hereby Further Resolved, Found and Declared by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois that the compensation to be paid by it for said land cannot be agreed upon between this Board of Trustees and the owners of said property and they and it are unable to agree upon the purchase price to be paid to said owners for the sale and conveyance of said land by said owners thereof to said The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois; and

Therefore, Be It, and It Is Hereby Further Resolved, Found and Declared by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois that because of said need of the University of Illinois for said land for the purposes hereinabove set forth and because the compensation to be paid to the owners thereof for such land cannot be agreed upon between them and this Board of Trustees, it is necessary for The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois to take said land and acquire title thereto through the exercise by it of the right of eminent domain conferred upon it by law and to have the compensation to be paid by it to the owners thereof and any and all other persons who may have any right, title or interest in and to said land determined in the manner provided by law for the exercise of said right and power of eminent domain; and

Be It, and It Is Hereby Further Resolved by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois that the necessary and appropriate action be taken for the acquisition of title to said property by said The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois and to have the compensation to be paid therefor determined by the institution and prosecution to completion of a proceeding in eminent domain in a court of competent jurisdiction and that the Legal Counsel of the University be, and he is hereby, authorized to proceed accordingly, to institute and prosecute an eminent domain proceeding in the name and on behalf of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois for the acquisition of said land and the determination of the compensation to be paid by it therefor, and to employ such special legal counsel, appraisers, and others as he may deem necessary or desirable to assist him in the institution and prosecution of said proceeding.

ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY AT 1113 WEST OREGON STREET, URBANA, ILLINOIS

(36) The University has been negotiating with the owner of the property at 1113 West Oregon Street, Urbana, Illinois, which is adjacent to the site for the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts and is required as part of the site for an academic building. The property consists of a lot 65 feet by 157 feet (10,205 square feet) and is improved with a three-story and basement frame building used as apartments. The owners have been advised that a recommendation would be submitted to the Board of Trustees for the purchase of their property at a price of \$61,100, based on University appraisals, but this price is not acceptable to them. Accordingly, the Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that authorization be given for the acquisition of the property at 1113 West Oregon Street, Urbana, Illinois, through condemnation proceedings; and further request authorization of settlement of the condemna-

tion suit if such settlement can be effected at a price that is within the appraisals received by the University.

Be It, and It Is Hereby Further Resolved by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois that the necessary and appropriate action be taken for the acquisition of title to said property by said The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois and to have the compensation to be paid therefor determined by the institution and prosecution to completion of a proceeding in eminent domain in a court of competent jurisdiction and that the Legal Counsel of the University be, and he is hereby, authorized to proceed accordingly, to institute and prosecute an eminent domain proceeding in the name and on behalf of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois for the acquisition of said land and the determination of the compensation to be paid by it therefor, and to employ such special legal counsel, appraisers, and others as he may deem necessary or desirable to assist him in the institution and prosecution of said proceeding.
